AN ACT

To require intelligence community reporting on foreign fighter flows to and from terrorist safe havens abroad, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Tracking Foreign
3 Fighters in Terrorist Safe Havens Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY REPORTING TO CON-**
5 **GRESS ON FOREIGN FIGHTER FLOWS.**

6 (a) **REPORTS REQUIRED.**—Not later than 60 days
7 after the date of the enactment of this Act, and every 180
8 days thereafter, the Director of National Intelligence, con-
9 sistent with the protection of intelligence sources and
10 methods, shall submit to the appropriate congressional
11 committees a report on foreign fighter flows to and from
12 terrorist safe havens abroad.

13 (b) **CONTENTS.**—Each report submitted under sub-
14 section (a) shall include, with respect to each terrorist safe
15 haven, the following:

16 (1) The total number of foreign fighters who
17 have traveled or are suspected of having traveled to
18 the terrorist safe haven since 2011, including the
19 countries of origin of such foreign fighters.

20 (2) The total number of United States citizens
21 present in the terrorist safe haven.

22 (3) The total number of foreign fighters who
23 have left the terrorist safe haven or whose where-
24 abouts are unknown.

25 (c) **FORM.**—The reports submitted under subsection
26 (a) may be submitted in classified form. If such a report

1 is submitted in classified form, such report shall also in-
2 clude an unclassified summary.

3 (d) SUNSET.—The requirement to submit reports
4 under subsection (a) shall terminate on the date that is
5 two years after the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 (e) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
7 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congress-
8 sional committees” means—

9 (1) in the Senate—

10 (A) the Committee on Armed Services;

11 (B) the Select Committee on Intelligence;

12 (C) the Committee on the Judiciary;

13 (D) the Committee on Homeland Security
14 and Governmental Affairs;

15 (E) the Committee on Banking, Housing,
16 and Urban Affairs;

17 (F) the Committee on Foreign Relations;

18 and

19 (G) the Committee on Appropriations; and

20 (2) in the House of Representatives—

21 (A) the Committee on Armed Services;

22 (B) the Permanent Select Committee on
23 Intelligence;

24 (C) the Committee on the Judiciary;

25 (D) the Committee on Homeland Security;

- 1 (E) the Committee on Financial Services;
- 2 (F) the Committee on Foreign Affairs; and
- 3 (G) the Committee on Appropriations.
