A BILL

To require an exercise related to terrorist and foreign fighter travel, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Terrorist and Foreign*
5 *Fighter Travel Exercise Act of 2016”.*

6 **SEC. 2. EXERCISE ON TERRORIST AND FOREIGN FIGHTER**
7 **TRAVEL.**

8 *(a) IN GENERAL.—In addition to, or as part of exer-*
9 *cise programs currently carried out by the Department of*
10 *Homeland Security, to enhance domestic preparedness for*
11 *and collective response to terrorism, promote the dissemina-*
12 *tion of homeland security information, and test the security*
13 *posture of the United States, the Secretary of Homeland*
14 *Security, through appropriate offices and components of the*
15 *Department and in coordination with the relevant Federal*
16 *departments and agencies, shall, not later than one year*
17 *after the date of the enactment of this Act, develop and con-*
18 *duct an exercise related to the terrorist and foreign fighter*
19 *threat.*

20 *(b) EXERCISE REQUIREMENTS.—The exercise required*
21 *under subsection (a) shall include—*

22 *(1) a scenario involving—*

23 *(A) persons traveling from the United*
24 *States to join or provide material support or re-*
25 *sources to a terrorist organization abroad; and*

1 (B) *terrorist infiltration into the United*
2 *States, including United States citizens and for-*
3 *foreign nationals; and*

4 (2) *coordination with appropriate Federal de-*
5 *partments and agencies, foreign governments, and*
6 *State, local, tribal, territorial, and private sector*
7 *stakeholders.*

8 (c) *REPORT.*—*Not later than 60 days after the comple-*
9 *tion of the exercise required under subsection (a), the Sec-*
10 *retary of Homeland Security shall, consistent with the pro-*
11 *tection of classified information, submit an after-action re-*
12 *port to the Committee on Homeland Security of the House*
13 *of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Secu-*
14 *rity and Governmental Affairs of the Senate presenting the*
15 *initial findings of such exercise, including any identified*
16 *or potential vulnerabilities in United States defenses and*
17 *any legislative changes requested in light of the findings.*
18 *The report shall be submitted in unclassified form, but may*
19 *include a classified annex.*

20 (d) *PROHIBITION ON ADDITIONAL FUNDING.*—*No ad-*
21 *ditional funds are authorized to be appropriated to carry*
22 *out this section. This section shall be carried out using*
23 *amounts otherwise appropriated or made available to the*
24 *Department of Homeland Security.*

1 (e) *DEFINITION.*—*In this section, the term “material*
2 *support or resources” has the meaning given such term in*
3 *section 2339A of title 18, United States Code.*

4 **SEC. 3. EMERGING THREATS IN THE NATIONAL EXERCISE**
5 **PROGRAM.**

6 *Subparagraph (A) of section 648(b)(2) of the Post-*
7 *Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006 (6*
8 *U.S.C. 748(b)(2)) is amended—*

9 (1) *in clause (v), by striking “and” at the end;*
10 *and*

11 (2) *by adding after clause (vi) the following new*
12 *clause:*

13 “(vii) *designed, to the extent prac-*
14 *ticable, to include emerging terrorist*
15 *threats, such as scenarios involving United*
16 *States citizens departing the United States*
17 *to enlist with or provide material support*
18 *or resources to terrorist organizations*
19 *abroad or terrorist infiltration into the*
20 *United States, including United States citi-*
21 *zens and foreign nationals; and”.*

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
