- To increase engagement with the governments of the Caribbean region, the Caribbean diaspora community in the United States, and the private sector and civil society in both the United States and the Caribbean, and for other purposes.

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "United States-Carib				
3	bean Strategic Engagement Act of 2016".				
4	SEC. 2. STATEMENT OF POLICY.				
5	Congress declares that it is the policy of the Unite				
6	States to increase engagement with the governments of				
7	the Caribbean region, the Caribbean diaspora community				
8	in the United States, and the private sector and civil soci				
9	ety in both the United States and the Caribbean in a con				
10	certed effort to—				
11	(1) enhance diplomatic relations between the				
12	United States and the Caribbean region;				
13	(2) increase economic cooperation between th				
14	United States and the Caribbean region;				
15	(3) support regional economic, political, and se				
16	curity integration efforts in the Caribbean region;				
17	(4) encourage sustainable economic develop				
18	ment and increased regional economic diversification				
19	and global competitiveness;				
20	(5) reduce levels of crime and violence, curb the				
21	trafficking of illicit drugs, strengthen the rule of law				
22	and improve citizen security;				
23	(6) improve energy security by increasing access				
24	to diverse, reliable, affordable, and sustainable

- 3 1 (7) advance cooperation on democracy and 2 human rights in the Caribbean region and at multi-3 lateral fora; and (8) continue support for public health advances 5 and cooperation on health concerns and threats to 6 the Caribbean region. 7 SEC. 3. STRATEGY. 8 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State, in coordination 10 with the Administrator of the United States Agency for
- International Development (USAID), shall submit to the 12 appropriate congressional committees a multi-year strat-13 egy for United States engagement with the Caribbean re-14 gion that—
 - (1) identifies Department of State and USAID efforts, in coordination with other executive branch agencies, to prioritize United States policy towards the Caribbean region;
 - (2) outlines an approach to broaden Department of State and USAID outreach to the Caribbean diaspora community in the United States to promote their involvement and participation in the economic development and citizen security of the Caribbean region;

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- 1 (3) outlines an approach to partner with the 2 governments of the Caribbean region to improve cit-3 izen security, reduce the trafficking of illicit drugs, 4 strengthen the rule of law, and improve the effective-5 ness and sustainability of the Caribbean Basin Secu-6 rity Initiative;
 - (4) establishes a comprehensive, integrated, multi-year strategy to encourage the efforts of the Caribbean region to implement regional and national strategies that improve energy security by increasing access to diverse, reliable, affordable, and sustainable power, including significant renewable energy resources within the Caribbean region such as biomass, geothermal, hydropower, solar, tidal, waste-to-energy, and wind, and by taking advantage of the ongoing energy revolution in the Unites States;
 - (5) outlines an approach to improve diplomatic engagement with the governments of the Caribbean region, including with respect to key votes on human rights and democracy at the United Nations and the Organization of American States;
 - (6) develops an approach to assisting Caribbean countries in the diversification of their economies, the reduction of legal, technical, and administrative barriers that prevent the free flow of foreign direct

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- 1 investment and trade to and from each country and
- 2 within the Caribbean region, and support for the
- 3 training and employment of youth and citizens in
- 4 marginalized communities; and
- 5 (7) reflects the input of other executive branch
- 6 agencies, as appropriate.

7 SEC. 4. BRIEFINGS.

- 8 The Secretary of State shall provide annual briefings
- 9 to the appropriate congressional committees that review
- 10 Department of State efforts to implement the strategy for
- 11 United States engagement with the Caribbean region in
- 12 accordance with section 3.

13 SEC. 5. PROGRESS REPORT.

- Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment
- 15 of this Act and biennially thereafter for the following 4
- 16 years, the President shall transmit to the appropriate con-
- 17 gressional committees a report on progress made toward
- 18 to implementing the strategy for United States engage-
- 19 ment with the Caribbean region in accordance with section
- 20 3.

21 SEC. 6. GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY OFFICE REPORT

- 22 ON CARIBBEAN BASIN SECURITY INITIATIVE.
- Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment
- 24 of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States

- 1 shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees
- 2 a report that contains the following:
- 3 (1) An evaluation of the Caribbean Basin Secu-
- 4 rity Initiative (CBSI) and the extent to which the
- 5 CBSI has met Department of State and USAID
- 6 benchmarks.
- 7 (2) An accounting of CBSI funding appro-
- 8 priated, obligated, and expended from fiscal year
- 9 2010 through fiscal year 2016.
- 10 (3) A breakdown of yearly CBSI assistance pro-
- 11 vided to each CBSI country.
- 12 (4) A description of how CBSI is coordinated
- with other security assistance programs in the West-
- ern Hemisphere, particularly the Merida Initiative
- and the Central America Regional Security Initia-
- tive, and the role of the Department of State's Sen-
- ior Coordinator for the Citizen Security Initiatives in
- the Western Hemisphere in such coordination.
- 19 (5) A description of all United States security
- assistance provided to the Caribbean region, exclu-
- sive of assistance through CBSI.
- 22 (6) Recommendations for legislative and execu-
- 23 tive action to make CBSI more effective and effi-
- cient, as appropriate.

SEC. 7. GAO REPORT ON DIPLOMATIC ENGAGEMENT IN 2 THE EASTERN CARIBBEAN. 3 Not later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States 4 5 shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report that contains the following: 6 7 (1) An evaluation of United States diplomatic 8 outreach from the United States embassy in Bar-9 bados to the countries of Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia and St. 10 11 Vincent, and the Grenadines. 12 (2) A list of visits over the previous 5 years of 13 personnel at the United States embassy in Barbados 14 to the countries of Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, 15 St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent, and 16 the Grenadines. 17 (3) A description of how personnel at the 18 United States embassy in Barbados have engaged 19 with government officials and civil society organiza-20 tions in Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, St. Kitts 21 and Nevis, St. Lucia and St. Vincent, and the Gren-22 adines over the previous 5 years. 23 (4) A description of how personnel at the 24 United States embassy in Grenada have engaged 25 with government officials and civil society organiza-

tions over the previous 5 years.

SEC. 8. REPORTING COST OFFSET.

- 3 ice Act of 1980 (22 U.S.C. 4001(c)) is amended in the
- 4 matter preceding subparagraph (A), by striking "the fol-
- 5 lowing:" and all that follows through "A workforce plan"
- 6 and inserting "a workforce plan" and adjusting the mar-
- 7 gins accordingly.

8 SEC. 9. DEFINITIONS.

- 9 In this Act:
- 10 (1) Appropriate congressional commit-
- 11 TEES.—The term "appropriate congressional com-
- mittees' means the Committee on Foreign Affairs of
- the House of Representatives and the Committee on
- 14 Foreign Relations of the Senate.
- 15 (2) CARIBBEAN REGION.—The term "Caribbean
- 16 region" means the Caribbean Basin Security Initia-
- tive beneficiary countries.
- 18 (3) Security assistance.—The term "secu-
- rity assistance" has the meaning given such term in
- section 502B(b) of the Foreign Assistance Act of
- 21 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2304(d)).
