7	AIRPLANES; TRAINING ON SPECIAL PROCE-
8	DURES.
9	Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact-
10	ment of this Act, the Administrator of the Transportation
11	Security Administration shall—
12	(1) notify air carriers and security screening
13	personnel of the Transportation Security Adminis-
14	tration and personnel of private security companies
15	providing security screening pursuant to section
16	44920 of title 49, United States Code, of such Ad-
17	ministration's guidelines regarding permitting baby
18	formula, breast milk, purified deionized water for in-
19	fants, and juice on airplanes under the Administra-
20	tion's guidelines known as the 3–1–1 Liquids Rule
