A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to notify air carriers and security screening personnel of the Transportation Security Administration of such Administration's guidelines regarding permitting baby formula, breast milk, and juice on airplanes, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Bottles and Breast-*
5 *feeding Equipment Screening Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. TSA SECURITY SCREENING GUIDELINES FOR BABY**
7 **FORMULA, BREAST MILK, PURIFIED DEION-**
8 **IZED WATER FOR INFANTS, AND JUICE ON**
9 **AIRPLANES; TRAINING ON SPECIAL PROCE-**
10 **DURES.**

11 *Not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment*
12 *of this Act, the Administrator of the Transportation Secu-*
13 *rity Administration shall—*

14 *(1) notify air carriers and security screening*
15 *personnel of the Transportation Security Administra-*
16 *tion and personnel of private security companies pro-*
17 *viding security screening pursuant to section 44920 of*
18 *title 49, United States Code, of such Administration’s*
19 *guidelines regarding permitting baby formula, breast*
20 *milk, purified deionized water for infants, and juice*
21 *on airplanes under the Administration’s guidelines*
22 *known as the 3–1–1 Liquids Rule Exemption; and*

23 *(2) in training procedures for security screening*
24 *personnel of the Administration and private security*
25 *companies providing security screening pursuant to*

- 1 *section 44920 of title 49, United States Code, include*
- 2 *training on special screening procedures.*

Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to direct the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration to notify air carriers and security screening personnel of the Transportation Security Administration of such Administration’s guidelines regarding permitting baby formula, breast milk, and juice on airplanes, and for other purposes.”.

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
