1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Cyber Preparedness

4 SEC. 2. INFORMATION SHARING.

(i) in paragraph (10), by inserting before the semicolon at the end the following: ", including, in coordination with the national cybersecurity and communications integration center under section 227, accessing timely technical assistance, risk management support, and incident response capabilities with respect to cyber threat indicators, defensive measures, cybersecurity risks, and incidents (as such terms are defined in such section), which may include attribution, mitigation, and remediation, and the provision of information and recommendations on security and resilience, including implications of cybersecurity risks to equipment and technology related to the electoral process";

16	SEC. 3. HOMELAND SECURITY GRANTS.
17	Subsection (a) of section 2008 of the Homeland Secu-
18	rity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 609) is amended—
19	(1) by redesignating paragraphs (4) through
20	(14) as paragraphs (5) through (15), respectively;
21	and
22	(2) by inserting after paragraph (3) the fol-
23	lowing new paragraph:
24	"(4) enhancing cybersecurity, including pre-
25	paring for and responding to cybersecurity risks and

- 2 formation analysis and dissemination activities;".

3 SEC. 4. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

- 4 It is the sense of Congress that to facilitate the timely
- 5 dissemination to appropriate State, local, and private sec-
- 6 tor stakeholders of homeland security information related
- 7 to cyber threats, the Secretary of Homeland Security
- 8 should, to the greatest extent practicable, work to share
- 9 actionable information related to cyber threats in an un-
- 10 classified form.
