## A BILL

To provide that it shall be unlawful for foreign nationals of a country that limits the free exercise of religion in that country to make any expenditure in the United States to promote a religion in the United States, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Religious Freedom  
5 International Reciprocity Enhancement Act” or the “Reli-  
6 gious FIRE Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. RECIPROCITY ENFORCEMENT REGARDING RELI-**  
2 **GIUS FREEDOM.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—It shall be unlawful for a foreign  
4 national of a country that limits the free exercise of reli-  
5 gion in that country to make any expenditure in the  
6 United States to promote a religion.

7 (b) FORFEITURE.—Any asset consisting of such an  
8 expenditure or the proceeds of such an expenditure is sub-  
9 ject to forfeiture to the United States. The Attorney Gen-  
10 eral may, upon probable cause, seize any such asset and  
11 in a civil action obtain its forfeiture to the United States.

12 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

13 (1) the term “country that limits the free exer-  
14 cise of religion” means a country designated as such  
15 by the Secretary of State acting through the Assist-  
16 ant Secretary for Democracy, Human Rights, and  
17 Labor; and

18 (2) the term “expenditure to promote a reli-  
19 gion” includes the funding and practice of religious  
20 services, religious education, evangelical outreach,  
21 and publication and dissemination of religious lit-  
22 erature.
