1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Promoting Travel,
- 3 Commerce, and National Security Act of 2016".
- 4 SEC. 2. JURISDICTION OVER OFFENSES COMMITTED BY
- 5 CERTAIN UNITED STATES PERSONNEL STA-
- 6 TIONED IN CANADA.
- 7 (a) AMENDMENT.—Chapter 212A of title 18, United
- 8 States Code, is amended—
- 9 (1) in the chapter heading, by striking
- 10 "TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS"; and
- 11 (2) by adding after section 3272 the following:
- 12 "§ 3273. Offenses committed by certain United States
- personnel stationed in Canada in further-
- ance of border security initiatives
- 15 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Whoever, while employed by the
- 16 Department of Homeland Security or the Department of
- 17 Justice and stationed or deployed in Canada pursuant to
- 18 a treaty, executive agreement, or bilateral memorandum
- 19 in furtherance of a border security initiative, engages in
- 20 conduct (or conspires or attempts to engage in conduct)
- 21 in Canada that would constitute an offense for which a
- 22 person may be prosecuted in a court of the United States
- 23 had the conduct been engaged in within the United States
- 24 or within the special maritime and territorial jurisdiction
- 25 of the United States shall be fined or imprisoned, or both,
- 26 as provided for that offense.

"(b) Definition.—In this section, the term 'em-
