3 **SECTION 1. DEFINITION OF “OFFICIAL PURPOSE” FOR**
4 **DRIVERS’ LICENSES AND PERSONAL IDENTI-**
5 **FICATION CARDS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 201(3) of the Emergency
7 Supplemental Appropriations Act for Defense, the Global
8 War on Terror, and Tsunami Relief, 2005 (Public Law

1 109–13; 119 Stat. 312; 49 U.S.C. 30301 note) is amend-
2 ed—

3 (1) by striking “includes but is not limited to”
4 and inserting “means”;

5 (2) by striking “aircraft, entering” and insert-
6 ing “aircraft, and entering”; and

7 (3) by striking “, and any other purposes that
8 the Secretary shall determine”.

9 (b) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 180 days
10 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
11 of Homeland Security shall submit to Congress a report
12 on the implementation of the amendments made by this
13 Act.
