Mrs. BLACKBURN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To modify the boundary of the Shiloh National Military Park located in Tennessee and Mississippi, to establish Parker’s Crossroads Battlefield as an affiliated area of the National Park System, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Shiloh National Mili-
5 tary Park Boundary Adjustment and Parker’s Crossroads
6 Battlefield Designation Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

8 In this Act, the following definitions apply:

1 (1) AFFILIATED AREA.—The term “affiliated
2 area” means the Parker’s Crossroads Battlefield es-
3 tablished as an affiliated area of the National Park
4 System under section 4.

5 (2) PARK.—The term “Park” means Shiloh
6 National Military Park, a unit of the National Park
7 System.

8 (3) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
9 the Secretary of the Interior.

10 **SEC. 3. AREAS TO BE ADDED TO SHILOH NATIONAL MILI-**
11 **TARY PARK.**

12 (a) ADDITIONAL AREAS.—The boundary of Shiloh
13 National Military Park is modified to include the areas
14 that are generally depicted on the map entitled “Shiloh
15 National Military Park, Proposed Boundary Adjustment”,
16 numbered 304/80,011, and dated April 2012 as follows:

17 (1) Fallen Timbers Battlefield.

18 (2) Russell House Battlefield.

19 (3) Davis Bridge Battlefield.

20 (b) ACQUISITION AUTHORITY.—The Secretary may
21 acquire lands described in subsection (a) by donation, pur-
22 chase from willing sellers with donated or appropriated
23 funds, or exchange.

24 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—Any lands acquired under
25 this section shall be administered as part of the Park.

1 **SEC. 4. ESTABLISHMENT OF AFFILIATED AREA.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Parker’s Crossroads Battlefield in
3 the State of Tennessee is hereby established as an affili-
4 ated area of the National Park System.

5 (b) DESCRIPTION.—The affiliated area shall consist
6 of the area generally depicted within the “Proposed
7 Boundary” on the map entitled “Parker’s Crossroads Bat-
8 tlefield, Proposed Boundary”, numbered 903/80,073, and
9 dated April 2012.

10 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—The affiliated area shall be
11 managed in accordance with this Act and all laws gen-
12 erally applicable to units of the National Park System.

13 (d) MANAGEMENT ENTITY.—The City of Parkers
14 Crossroads and the Tennessee Historical Commission
15 shall jointly be the management entity for the affiliated
16 area.

17 (e) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—The Secretary
18 may provide technical assistance and enter into coopera-
19 tive agreements with the management entity for the pur-
20 pose of providing financial assistance with marketing,
21 marking, interpretation, and preservation of the affiliated
22 area.

23 (f) LIMITED ROLE OF THE SECRETARY.—Nothing in
24 this Act authorizes the Secretary to acquire property at
25 the affiliated area or to assume overall financial responsi-

1 bility for the operation, maintenance, or management of
2 the affiliated area.

3 (g) GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, in consulta-
5 tion with the management entity, shall develop a
6 general management plan for the affiliated area.
7 The plan shall be prepared in accordance with sec-
8 tion 12(b) of Public Law 91–383 (16 U.S.C. 1a–1
9 et seq.; commonly known as the National Park Sys-
10 tem General Authorities Act).

11 (2) TRANSMITTAL.—Not later than 3 years
12 after the date that funds are made available for this
13 Act, the Secretary shall provide a copy of the com-
14 pleted general management to the Committee on
15 Natural Resources of the House of Representatives
16 and the Committee on Energy and Natural Re-
17 sources of the Senate.

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
