Mr. KING of Iowa introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To require the country of origin of certain special immigrant religious workers to extend reciprocal immigration treatment to nationals of the United States.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Religious Worker Visa
5 Reciprocity Act of 2015”.

6 **SEC. 2. REQUIRING RECIPROCAL IMMIGRATION TREAT-**
7 **MENT.**

8 Section 204(a)(1)(G) of the Immigration and Nation-
9 ality Act (8 U.S.C. 1154(a)(1)(G)) is amended by adding
10 at the end the following:

1 “(iii) Beginning on October 1, 2015, no petition may
2 be approved for classification of an alien as a special immi-
3 grant under section 101(a)(27)(C) if the Secretary of
4 Homeland Security has determined that the country of the
5 alien’s nationality—

6 “(I) is identified as a ‘Country of Particular
7 Concern’ or a country where religious freedom is of
8 significant interest in the 2013 International Reli-
9 gious Freedom Report; or

10 “(II) does not extend reciprocal immigration
11 treatment to nationals of the United States who are
12 seeking resident status in order to work in a reli-
13 gious vocation or occupation.”.
