#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "CO-OP Consumer

4	SEC. 2. EXEMPTION FROM INDIVIDUAL MANDATE FOR CER-
5	TAIN INDIVIDUALS WHO HAD COVERAGE
6	UNDER A TERMINATED HEALTH PLAN FUND-
7	ED THROUGH THE CONSUMER OPERATED
8	AND ORIENTED PLAN (CO-OP) PROGRAM.
9	(a) In General.—Section 5000A(e) of the Internal
10	Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by adding at the end
11	the following new paragraph:
12	"(6) CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS PREVIOUSLY EN-
13	ROLLED IN HEALTH PLANS FUNDED THROUGH THE
14	CONSUMER OPERATED AND ORIENTED PLAN (CO-OP)
15	PROGRAM.—Any applicable individual for any month
16	if—
17	"(A) such individual was enrolled in min-
18	imum essential coverage offered by a qualified
19	nonprofit health insurance issuer (as defined in
20	subsection (c) of section 1322 of the Patient
21	Protection and Affordable Care Act (42 U.S.C.
22	18042)) receiving funds with respect to such
23	coverage through the Consumer Operated and
24	Oriented Plan program established under such
25	section,

1	"(B) during the calendar year which in-
2	cludes such month, such issuer terminated such
3	coverage in the area in which the individual re-
4	sides, and
5	"(C) such month ends after the date on
6	which such coverage was so terminated.".
7	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
8	subsection (a) shall apply with respect to months begin-
9	ning after December 31, 2013.
