RESOLUTION

Providing for the expenses of certain committees of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred Fourteenth Congress.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. COMMITTEE EXPENSES FOR THE ONE HUN-**
3 **DRED FOURTEENTH CONGRESS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—With respect to the One Hundred
5 Fourteenth Congress, there shall be paid out of the appli-
6 cable accounts of the House of Representatives, in accord-

1 ance with this primary expense resolution, not more than
2 the amount specified in subsection (b) for the expenses
3 (including the expenses of all staff salaries) of each com-
4 mittee named in such subsection.

5 (b) COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.—The committees
6 and amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee
7 on Agriculture, \$10,173,096; Committee on Armed Serv-
8 ices, \$14,208,340; Committee on the Budget,
9 \$10,380,424; Committee on Education and the Workforce,
10 \$14,044,580; Committee on Energy and Commerce,
11 \$19,531,442; Committee on Ethics, \$6,201,326; Com-
12 mittee on Financial Services, \$15,086,852; Committee on
13 Foreign Affairs, \$14,923,986; Committee on Homeland
14 Security, \$14,407,846; Committee on House Administra-
15 tion, \$9,293,130; Permanent Select Committee on Intel-
16 ligence, \$9,197,310; Committee on the Judiciary,

1 **SEC. 2. FIRST SESSION LIMITATIONS.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Of the amount provided for in
3 section 1 for each committee named in subsection (b), not
4 more than the amount specified in such subsection shall
5 be available for expenses incurred during the period begin-
6 ning at noon on January 3, 2015, and ending immediately
7 before noon on January 3, 2016.

8 (b) COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.—The committees
9 and amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee
10 on Agriculture, \$5,086,548; Committee on Armed Serv-
11 ices, \$7,104,170; Committee on the Budget, \$5,190,212;
12 Committee on Education and the Workforce, \$7,022,290;

14 mittee on Ethics, \$3,100,663; Committee on Financial
15 Services, \$7,543,426; Committee on Foreign Affairs,

3 **SEC. 3. SECOND SESSION LIMITATIONS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Of the amount provided for in
5 section 1 for each committee named in subsection (b), not
6 more than the amount specified in such subsection shall
7 be available for expenses incurred during the period begin-
8 ning at noon on January 3, 2016, and ending immediately
9 before noon on January 3, 2017.

10 (b) COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.—The committees
11 and amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee
12 on Agriculture, \$5,086,548; Committee on Armed Serv-
13 ices, \$7,104,170; Committee on the Budget, \$5,190,212;
14 Committee on Education and the Workforce, \$7,022,290;
15 Committee on Energy and Commerce, \$9,765,721; Com-
16 mittee on Ethics, \$3,100,663; Committee on Financial
17 Services, \$7,543,426; Committee on Foreign Affairs,
18 \$7,461,993; Committee on Homeland Security,
19 \$7,203,923; Committee on House Administration,
20 \$4,646,565; Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence,
21 \$4,598,655; Committee on the Judiciary, \$7,197,786;

5 (c) REVIEW OF USE OF FUNDS IN FIRST SESSION.—

6 (1) REVIEW.—None of the amounts provided
7 for in section 1 for a committee named in subsection
8 (b) may be available for expenses of the committee
9 after March 15, 2016, unless the chair or ranking
10 minority member of the committee appears and pre-
11 sents testimony at a hearing of the Committee on
12 House Administration held prior to such date to re-
13 view the committee's use of the amounts provided
14 for in section 1 during the first session of the One
15 Hundred Fourteenth Congress and to determine
16 whether the amount specified in subsection (b) with
17 respect to the committee should be updated on the
18 basis of the review.

19 (2) WAIVER.—The Committee on House Ad-
20 ministration may waive the application of paragraph
21 (1) to any or all of the committees named in sub-
22 section (b).

23 **SEC. 4. VOUCHERS.**

24 Payments under this resolution shall be made on
25 vouchers authorized by the committee involved, signed by

1 the chairman of such committee, and approved in the
2 manner directed by the Committee on House Administra-
3 tion.

4 **SEC. 5. REGULATIONS.**

5 Amounts made available under this resolution shall
6 be expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by
7 the Committee on House Administration.

8 **SEC. 6. RESERVE FUND FOR UNANTICIPATED EXPENSES.**

9 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is hereby established a
10 reserve fund for unanticipated expenses of committees for
11 the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress.

12 (b) AMOUNT.—The reserve fund under this section
13 shall have a balance of \$1,000,000, of which—

14 (1) \$500,000 shall be available for unantici-
15 pated expenses incurred during the period beginning
16 at noon on January 3, 2015, and ending imme-
17 diately before noon on January 3, 2016; and

18 (2) \$500,000 shall be available for unantici-
19 pated expenses incurred during the period beginning
20 at noon on January 3, 2016, and ending imme-
21 diately before noon on January 3, 2017.

22 (c) ALLOCATION TO COMMITTEES.—Amounts in the
23 reserve fund under this section shall be paid to a com-
24 mittee pursuant to an allocation approved by the Com-
25 mittee on House Administration.

1 **SEC. 7. ADJUSTMENT AUTHORITY.**

2 The Committee on House Administration shall have
3 authority to make adjustments in amounts under section
4 1, if necessary to comply with an order of the President
5 issued under section 251A or 254 of the Balanced Budget
6 and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or to conform
7 to any change in appropriations for the purposes of such
8 section 1.

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
