Mr. WOODALL, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

---

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 27) establishing the budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2016 and setting forth appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2017 through 2025.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of  
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 27) estab-

1 lishing the budget for the United States Government for  
2 fiscal year 2016 and setting forth appropriate budgetary  
3 levels for fiscal years 2017 through 2025. The first read-  
4 ing of the concurrent resolution shall be dispensed with.  
5 All points of order against consideration of the concurrent  
6 resolution are waived. General debate shall not exceed four  
7 hours, with three hours of general debate confined to the  
8 congressional budget equally divided and controlled by the  
9 chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on  
10 the Budget and one hour of general debate on the subject  
11 of economic goals and policies equally divided and con-  
12 trolled by Representative Brady of Texas and Representa-  
13 tive Carolyn Maloney of New York or their respective des-  
14 ignees. After general debate the concurrent resolution  
15 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute  
16 rule. The concurrent resolution shall be considered as  
17 read. No amendment shall be in order except those printed  
18 in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying  
19 this resolution. Each such amendment may be offered only  
20 in the order printed in the report, may be offered only  
21 by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered  
22 as read, and shall be debatable for the time specified in  
23 the report equally divided and controlled by the proponent  
24 and an opponent. All points of order against such amend-  
25 ments are waived. If more than one such amendment is

1 adopted, then only the one receiving the greater number  
2 of affirmative votes shall be considered as finally adopted.  
3 In the case of a tie for the greater number of affirmative  
4 votes, then only the last amendment to receive that num-  
5 ber of affirmative votes shall be considered as finally  
6 adopted. After the conclusion of consideration of the con-  
7 current resolution for amendment and a final period of  
8 general debate, which shall not exceed 10 minutes equally  
9 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority  
10 member of the Committee on the Budget, the Committee  
11 shall rise and report the concurrent resolution to the  
12 House with such amendment as may have been finally  
13 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
14 dered on the concurrent resolution and amendments there-  
15 to to adoption without intervening motion except amend-  
16 ments offered by the chair of the Committee on the Budg-  
17 et pursuant to section 305(a)(5) of the Congressional  
18 Budget Act of 1974 to achieve mathematical consistency.  
19 The concurrent resolution shall not be subject to a demand  
20 for division of the question of its adoption.
