RESOLUTION

Amending the Rules of the House of Representatives to
establish a Permanent Select Committee on Aging.

1 *Resolved*, That rule X of the Rules of the House of
2 Representatives is amended by adding at the end the fol-
3 lowing new clause:

4 **“Permanent Select Committee on Aging**

5 “12. There is established a Permanent Select Com-
6 mittee on Aging which shall not have legislative jurisdic-
7 tion but which shall have jurisdiction—

1 “(1) to conduct a continuing comprehensive
2 study and review of the problems of the older Amer-
3 ican, including but not limited to income mainte-
4 nance, poverty, housing, health (including medical
5 research), welfare, employment, education, recre-
6 ation, and long-term care;

7 “(2) to study the use of all practicable means
8 and methods of encouraging the development of pub-
9 lic and private programs and policies which will as-
10 sist the older American in taking a full part in na-
11 tional life and which will encourage the utilization of
12 the knowledge, skills, special aptitudes, and abilities
13 of older Americans to contribute to a better quality
14 of life for all Americans;

15 “(3) to develop policies that would encourage
16 the coordination of both governmental and private
17 programs designed to deal with problems of aging;
18 and

19 “(4) to review any recommendations made by
20 the President or by the White House Conference on
21 aging relation to programs or policies affecting older
22 Americans.”.

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
