A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to repeal the excise tax on medical devices.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medical Device Access
5 and Innovation Protection Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF MEDICAL DEVICE EXCISE TAX.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 32 of the Internal Rev-
8 enue Code of 1986 is amended by striking subchapter E.

9 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

1 (1) Subsection (a) of section 4221 of such Code
2 is amended by striking the last sentence.

3 (2) Paragraph (2) of section 6416(b) of such
4 Code is amended by striking the last sentence.

5 (c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sub-
6 chapter for chapter 32 of such Code is amended by strik-
7 ing the item related to subchapter E.

8 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
9 this section shall apply to sales after December 31, 2012.

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
