1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Social Security Child
- 3 Protection Act of 2018".
- 4 SEC. 2. REISSUANCE OF SOCIAL SECURITY ACCOUNT NUM-
- 5 BERS TO YOUNG CHILDREN IN CASES WHERE
- 6 CONFIDENTIALITY HAS BEEN COMPROMISED.
- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 205(c)(2)(B) of the Social
- 8 Security Act (42 U.S.C. 405(c)(2)(B)) is amended—
- 9 (1) by redesignating clause (iii) as clause (iv);
- 10 and
- 11 (2) by inserting after clause (ii) the following
- 12 new clause:
- 13 "(iii) In any case in which a Social Security account
- 14 number has been issued to a child who has not attained
- 15 the age of 14 pursuant to subclause (IV) or (V) of clause
- 16 (i) and it is demonstrated by evidence, as determined by
- 17 the Commissioner of Social Security, and submitted under
- 18 penalty of perjury to the Commissioner by a parent or
- 19 guardian of the child that in the course of transmission
- 20 of the social security card to the child, the confidentiality
- 21 of such number has been compromised by reason of theft
- 22 of such social security card, the Commissioner shall issue
- 23 a new Social Security account number to such child and
- 24 make note in the records maintained with respect to such
- 25 child of the pertinent information received by the Commis-
- 26 sioner regarding the theft of the social security card.".

- 1 (b) Effective Date.—The amendments made by
- 2 subsection (a) shall take effect on the date that is 180
- 3 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.
