Mr. CARTWRIGHT (for himself, Mr. BRIDENSTINE, Mrs. BUSTOS, Mr. JONES, Mr. LANCE, Mr. MCKINLEY, Mr. OLSON, and Mr. RICE of South Carolina) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committee on House Administration, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit the use of Federal funds for the costs of painting
portraits of officers and employees of the Federal Government.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Eliminating Govern-
5 ment-funded Oil-painting Act” or the “EGO Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS FOR PORTRAITS.**

2 (a) PROHIBITION.—No funds appropriated or other-
3 wise made available to the Federal Government may be
4 used to pay for the painting of a portrait of an officer
5 or employee of the Federal Government, including the
6 President, the Vice President, a Member of Congress, the
7 head of an executive agency, or the head of an office of
8 the legislative branch.

9 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

10 (1) the term “executive agency” has the mean-
11 ing given the term in section 133 of title 41, United
12 States Code; and

13 (2) the term “Member of Congress” includes a
14 Delegate or Resident Commissioner to Congress.

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
