AN ACT

To require an annual homeland threat assessment, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Homeland Threat As-
- 3 sessment Act".
- 4 SEC. 2. ANNUAL HOMELAND THREAT ASSESSMENTS.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subtitle A of title II of the Home-
- 6 land Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 121 et seq.) is amend-
- 7 ed by adding at the end the following new section:
- 8 "SEC. 210G. HOMELAND THREAT ASSESSMENTS.
- 9 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after
- 10 the date of the enactment of this section and for each of
- 11 the next 5 fiscal years (beginning in the fiscal year that
- 12 begins after the date of the enactment of this section) the
- 13 Secretary, acting through the Under Secretary for Intel-
- 14 ligence and Analysis, and using departmental information,
- 15 including component information, and information pro-
- 16 vided through State and major urban area fusion centers,
- 17 shall conduct an assessment of the terrorist threat to the
- 18 homeland.
- 19 "(b) Contents.—Each assessment under subsection
- 20 (a) shall include the following:
- 21 "(1) Empirical data assessing terrorist activi-
- ties and incidents over time in the United States, in-
- cluding terrorist activities and incidents planned or
- supported by persons outside of the United States
- 25 targeting the homeland.

- 1 "(2) An evaluation of current terrorist tactics, 2 as well as ongoing and possible future changes in 3 terrorist tactics.
 - "(3) An assessment of criminal activity encountered or observed by officers or employees of components in the field which is suspected of financing terrorist activity.
 - "(4) Detailed information on all individuals denied entry to or removed from the United States as a result of material support provided to a foreign terrorist organization (as such term is used in section 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1189)).
 - "(5) The efficacy and spread of foreign terrorist organization propaganda, messaging, or recruitment.
 - "(6) An assessment of threats, including cyber threats, to the homeland, including to critical infrastructure and Federal civilian networks.
 - "(7) An assessment of current and potential terrorism and criminal threats posed by individuals and organized groups seeking to unlawfully enter the United States.

1 "(8) An assessment of threats to the transpor-2 tation sector, including surface and aviation trans-3 portation systems. "(c) Additional Information.—The assessments 4 5 required under subsection (a)— "(1) shall, to the extent practicable, utilize ex-6 7 isting component data collected from the field; and 8 "(2) may incorporate relevant information and 9 analysis from other agencies of the Federal Govern-10 ment, agencies of State and local governments (in-11 cluding law enforcement agencies), as well as the 12 private sector, disseminated in accordance with 13 standard information sharing procedures and poli-14 cies. "(d) FORM.—The assessments required under sub-15 section (a) shall be shared with the appropriate congres-16 17 sional committees and submitted in classified form, but— 18 "(1) shall include unclassified summaries; and "(2) may include unclassified annexes, if appro-19 20 priate.". 21 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Subsection (d) of 22 section 201 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 23 U.S.C. 121) is amended by adding at the end the following new paragraph:

- 1 "(27) To carry out section 210G (relating to
- 2 homeland threat assessments).".
- 3 (c) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents
- 4 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is amended by in-
- 5 serting after the item relating to section 210F the fol-
- 6 lowing new item:

"Sec. 210G. Homeland threat assessments.".
