A BILL

To ensure fair treatment in licensing requirements for the
export of certain echinoderms.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF EXPORTATION OF CERTAIN**
4 **ECHINODERMS FROM PERMISSION AND LI-**
5 **CENSING REQUIREMENTS.**

6 (a) EXEMPTION.—Not later than 30 days after the
7 date of the enactment of this Act, the Director of the
8 United States Fish and Wildlife Service shall amend sec-

1 tion 14.92 of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations, to
2 clarify that—

3 (1) fish or wildlife described in subsection (b)
4 are fishery products exempt from the export permis-
5 sion requirements of section 9(d)(1) of the Endan-
6 gered Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1538(d)(1));
7 and

8 (2) any person may engage in business as an
9 exporter of such fish or wildlife without procuring
10 permission under such section of that Act or an ex-
11 port license under subpart I of part 14 of such title.

12 (b) COVERED FISH OR WILDLIFE.—The fish or wild-
13 life referred to in subsection (a) are members of the phy-
14 lum Echinodermata that are commonly known as sea ur-
15 chins and sea cucumbers, including products thereof,
16 that—

17 (1) do not require a permit under part 16, 17,
18 or 23 of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations;

19 (2) are harvested in waters under the jurisdic-
20 tion of the United States or are processed in the
21 United States; and

22 (3) are—

23 (A) exported for purposes of human or ani-
24 mal consumption; or

1 (B) taken in waters under the jurisdiction
2 of the United States or on the high seas for
3 recreational purposes.

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
