## A BILL

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study of the George W. Bush Childhood Home, located at 1412 West Ohio Avenue, Midland, Texas, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
  - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
  - 4 This Act may be cited as the "George W. Bush Child-
  - 5 hood Home Study Act".
  - 6 SEC. 2. SPECIAL RESOURCE STUDY.
  - 7 (a) Study.—The Secretary of the Interior shall con-
  - 8 duct a special resource study of the George W. Bush

- 1 Childhood Home, located at 1412 West Ohio Avenue, Mid-2 land, Texas (referred to in this section as the "site").
- 3 (b) CONTENTS.—In conducting the study under sub-4 section (a), the Secretary shall—
- 5 (1) evaluate the national significance of the 6 site;
- 7 (2) determine the suitability and feasibility of 8 designating the site as a unit of the National Park 9 System;
  - (3) consider other alternatives for preservation, protection, and interpretation of the site by Federal, State, or local governmental entities, or private and nonprofit organizations;
  - (4) consult with interested Federal, State, or local governmental entities, private and nonprofit organizations or any other interested individuals;
  - (5) determine the effect of the designation of the site as a unit of the National Park System on existing commercial and recreational uses, and the effect on State and local governments to manage those activities;
  - (6) identify any authorities, including condemnation, that will compel or permit the Secretary to influence or participate in local land use decisions (such as zoning) or place restrictions on non-Federal

- 2 Park System; and
- 3 (7) identify cost estimates for any Federal ac-
- 4 quisition, development, interpretation, operation, and
- 5 maintenance associated with the alternatives.
- 6 (c) APPLICABLE LAW.—The study required under
- 7 subsection (a) shall be conducted in accordance with sec-
- 8 tion 100507 of title 54, United States Code.
- 9 (d) STUDY RESULTS.—Not later than 3 years after
- 10 the date on which funds are first made available for the
- 11 study under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit to
- 12 the Committee on Natural Resources of the House of Rep-
- 13 resentatives and the Committee on Energy and Natural
- 14 Resources of the Senate the results of the study and any
- 15 conclusions and recommendations of the Secretary.

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
