## A BILL

To amend the Central Intelligence Agency Act of 1949 to improve death gratuities paid to the survivors of certain deceased officers and employees of the Central Intelligence Agency.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Gregg Wenzel Clandes-  
5 tine Heroes Parity Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. IMPROVED DEATH GRATUITIES FOR CERTAIN DE-**  
2 **CEASED OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE**  
3 **CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 11 of the Central Intel-  
5 ligence Agency Act of 1949 (50 U.S.C. 3511) is amend-  
6 ed—

7 (1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the  
8 following new paragraph:

9 “(3) If the Director determines that the deceased of-  
10 ficer or employee of the Agency does not have a surviving  
11 dependent, the Director shall make the payment under  
12 paragraph (1) to the next of kin of the deceased officer  
13 or employee, if any.”; and

14 (2) in subsection (b)(1), by striking “in an  
15 amount equal to” and inserting “the greater of  
16 \$100,000 or”.

17 (b) APPLICATION.—The amendment made by para-  
18 graph (1) of subsection (a) shall apply with respect to offi-  
19 cers and employees of the Central Intelligence Agency who  
20 die before, on, or after the date of the enactment of this  
21 Act, and the amendment made by paragraph (2) of such  
22 subsection shall apply with respect to officers and employ-  
23 ees of the Central Intelligence Agency who die on or after  
24 the date of the enactment of this Act.
