A BILL

To prohibit importation of seafood products of countries that do not prohibit the practice of shark finning, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Justice Attributed to
- 5 Wounded Sharks Act" or "JAWS Act".

1	SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON IMPORTATION OF SEAFOOD
2	PRODUCTS OF COUNTRIES THAT DO NOT
3	PROHIBIT THE PRACTICE OF SHARK FIN-
4	NING.
5	(a) In General.—No seafood product that is the
6	growth or product of a country described in subsection (b)
7	may be imported into the customs territory of the United
8	States on or after the date that is 90 days after the date
9	of the enactment of this Act.
10	(b) COUNTRY DESCRIBED.—A country described in
11	this subsection is a country with respect to which the
12	President determines does not prohibit the following:
13	(1) Shark finning in the territorial waters of
14	the country.
15	(2) The importation, sale, or possession of
16	shark fins obtained as a result of shark finning.
17	(e) Definitions.—In this section:
18	(1) Customs territory of the united
19	STATES.—The term "customs territory of the United
20	States" has the meaning given such term in general
21	note 2 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the
22	United States.
23	(2) Seafood Product.—The term "seafood
24	product" means any article that is classified under
25	chapter 3 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the
26	United States.

1 (3) SHARK FINNING.—The term "shark fin-2 ning" has the meaning given the term in section 9 3 of the Shark Finning Prohibition Act (16 U.S.C. 4 1822 note).
