Mr. TAYLOR (for himself and Mr. GONZALEZ of Texas) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce

A BILL

To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to expand eligibility for participation in the Federal Pell Grant program to certain trade schools.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Professional Pell Edu-
5 cation Learning” or the “PROPEL Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FEDERAL PELL GRANTS.**

7 (a) CLARIFICATION OF ELIGIBLE INSTITUTIONS.—

8 Section 401(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20

1 U.S.C. 1070a(a)) is amended by adding at the end the
2 following:

3 “(4) Notwithstanding any other provision of
4 this Act, for purposes of this section, the terms ‘eli-
5 gible institution’, ‘institution of higher education’,
6 ‘eligible program’, and ‘institution’ include a pro-
7 gram of education that—

8 “(A) consists of vocational or technical
9 training, flight training, or apprenticeship or
10 other on-job training;

11 “(B) an individual may pursue using edu-
12 cational assistance pursuant to section 3313(g)
13 of title 38, United States Code;

14 “(C) is less than 600 clock hours of in-
15 struction, 16 semester hours, or 24 quarter
16 hours, offered during a period of less than 15
17 weeks;

18 “(D) is not required to be accredited by a
19 nationally recognized accrediting agency or as-
20 sociation recognized by the Secretary pursuant
21 to part H;

22 “(E) is not required to lead to a recognized
23 educational credential;

24 “(F) for purposes of the reporting require-
25 ments under section 132(i), reports on all en-

1 rolled students without regard to whether a stu-
2 dent is a first-time, full-time, degree- or certifi-
3 cate-seeking student; and

4 “(G) except as otherwise provided in sub-
5 paragraphs (A) through (F) of this paragraph,
6 meets the requirements of this title for an insti-
7 tution to participate in the program under this
8 section.”.

9 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 484(a)(1)
10 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.
11 1091(a)(1)) is amended by inserting “or, for purposes of
12 the Federal Pell Grant program under section 401, a pro-
13 gram of education described in section 401(a)(4)” after
14 “section 487”.

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
