115TH CONGRESS 1ST SESSION H.R. 3897

AN ACT

- To amend title 10, United States Code, to provide for the issuance of the Gold Star Installation Access Card to the surviving spouse, dependent children, and other next of kin of a member of the Armed Forces who dies while serving on certain active or reserve duty, to ensure that a remarried surviving spouse with dependent children of the deceased member remains eligible for installation benefits to which the surviving spouse was previously eligible, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Gold Star Family Sup-3 port and Installation Access Act of 2017".

4 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

5 Congress makes the following findings:

6 (1) Since World War I, the gold star symbol
7 has been used by American families to honor mem8 bers of the Armed Forces who have given their lives
9 in service to the Nation.

10 (2) Surviving families of deceased members of
11 the Armed Forces confront many challenges, often
12 made worse by policies that fail to compassionately
13 honor the memory of their loved one's service and
14 sacrifice to the Nation.

(3) There is an obligation to ensure that the
Gold Star family connections to the military community remain an eternal bond providing strength and
comfort to surviving family members and to those
still serving.

(4) Individual military services have recognized
the need to provide installation access to Gold Star
families to attend memorial events, visit gravesites,
and access other benefits for which family members
are eligible and entitled.

25 (5) Surviving families of deceased members of
26 the Armed Forces relocate to other parts of the
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1	country, often far away from the service installation
2	where their loved one last served.
3	(6) Current Department of Defense policy re-
4	scinds on-base benefits to surviving spouses of de-
5	ceased service members who remarry, even when de-
6	pendent children under the guardianship of the sur-
7	viving spouse remain eligible for benefits, effectively
8	rendering these benefits inaccessible by the children
9	of the deceased member.
10	SEC. 3. ISSUANCE OF GOLD STAR INSTALLATION ACCESS
11	CARDS.
12	(a) Issuance and Conditions on Use.—
13	(1) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 57 of title 10,
14	United States Code, is amended by inserting after
15	section 1126 the following new section:
16	"§1126a. Gold Star Installation Access Card: issuance
17	and protections
18	"(a) Issuance to Gold Star Surviving Spouse
19	and Dependent Children of Deceased Member Re-
20	QUIRED.—The Secretary concerned shall provide for the
21	issuance of a standardized Gold Star Installation Access
22	Card to the widow and dependent children of a deceased
23	member of the armed forces described in section 1126(a)
24	of this title to facilitate their ability to gain unescorted
25	access to military installations for the purpose of attend-

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ing memorial events, visiting gravesites, and obtaining the
 on-installation services and benefits to which they are enti tled or eligible.

4 "(b) ISSUANCE TO OTHER NEXT OF KIN AUTHOR5 IZED.—At the discretion of the Secretary concerned, the
6 Secretary concerned may provide the Gold Star Installa7 tion Access Card to the parents and other next of kin of
8 a deceased member of the armed forces described in sec9 tion 1126(a) of this title.

10 "(c) SERVICE-WIDE ACCEPTANCE OF ACCESS CARD.—The Secretaries concerned shall work together to 11 12 ensure that a Gold Star Installation Access Card issued 13 by one armed force is accepted for access to military installations under the jurisdiction of another armed force. 14 15 "(d) PROTECTION OF INSTALLATION SECURITY.—In developing, issuing, and accepting the Gold Star Installa-16 tion Access Card, the Secretary concerned may take such 17 measures as the Secretary concerned considers nec-18 19 essary-

20 "(1) to prevent fraud in the procurement or use
21 of the Gold Star Installation Access Card;

"(2) to limit installation access to those areas
of the installation that provide the services and benefits for which the recipient of the Gold Star Installation Access Card is entitled or eligible; and

"(3) to ensure that the availability and use of
 the Gold Star Installation Access Card does not ad versely affect military installation security.

4 "(e) TERMINATION.—The Gold Star Installation Ac-5 cess Card for the widow and dependent children of a de-6 ceased member of the armed forces shall remain valid for 7 the life of the widow or child, regardless of subsequent 8 marital status of the widow, subject to periodic renewal 9 as determined by the Secretary concerned to ensure mili-10 tary installation security.".

(2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections at the beginning of chapter 57 of title 10,
United States Code, is amended by inserting after
the item relating to section 1126 the following new
item:

"1126a. Gold Star Installation Access Card: issuance and protections.".

(b) APPLICABILITY OF CURRENT DEFINITIONS.—
17 Section 1126(d) of title 10, United States Code is amend18 ed by striking the matter preceding paragraph (1) and in19 serting the following: "In this section and section 1126a
20 of this title:".

21 SEC. 4. EXTENSION OF COMMISSARY AND EXCHANGE BEN22 EFITS FOR REMARRIED SPOUSES WITH DE23 PENDENT CHILDREN.

24 (a) BENEFITS.—Section 1062 of title 10, United
25 States Code, is amended—

(1) by striking "The Secretary of Defense" and
 inserting the following:

3 "(a) CERTAIN UNREMARRIED FORMER SPOUSES.—
4 The Secretary of Defense"; and

5 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-6 section:

"(b) CERTAIN REMARRIED SURVIVING SPOUSES.— 7 8 The Secretary of Defense shall prescribe such regulations 9 as may be necessary to provide that a surviving spouse of a deceased member of the armed forces, regardless of 10 the marital status of the surviving spouse, who has guard-11 ianship of dependent children of the deceased member is 12 13 entitled to use commissary stores and MWR retail facilities to the same extent and on the same basis as the 14 15 unremarried surviving spouse of a member of the uniformed services.". 16

17 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section 1062 of18 title 10, United States Code, is further amended—

19 (1) by striking "commissary and exchange
20 privileges" and inserting "use commissary stores
21 and MWR retail facilities"; and

(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-section:

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"(c) MWR RETAIL FACILITIES.—The term 'MWR
 retail facilities' has the meaning given that term in section
 1063(e) of this title.".

4 (c) CLERICAL AMENDMENTS.—

5 (1) SECTION HEADING.—The heading of section
6 1062 of title 10, United States Code, is amended to
7 read as follows:

8 "§1062. Certain former spouses and surviving 9 spouses".

10 (2) TABLE OF SECTIONS.—The table of sections 11 at the beginning of chapter 54 of title 10, United 12 States Code, is amended by striking the item relat-13 ing to section 1062 and inserting the following new 14 item:

"1062. Certain former spouses and surviving spouses.".
