## **AN ACT**

- To provide for the development and dissemination of programs and materials for training pharmacists, health care providers, and patients on indicators that a prescription is fraudulent, forged, or otherwise indicative of abuse or diversion, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Empowering Phar-3 macists in the Fight Against Opioid Abuse Act".

4 SEC. 2. PROGRAMS AND MATERIALS FOR TRAINING ON
5 CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH A
6 PHARMACIST MAY DECLINE TO FILL A PRE7 SCRIPTION.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the 9 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services, in consultation with the Administrator 10 of the Drug Enforcement Administration, the Commis-11 sioner of Food and Drugs, the Director of the Centers for 12 13 Disease Control and Prevention, and the Assistant Secretary for Mental Health and Substance Use, shall develop 14 and disseminate programs and materials for training 15 16 pharmacists, health care providers, and patients on—

17 (1) circumstances under which a pharmacist 18 may, consistent with section 201 of the Controlled 19 Substances Act (21 U.S.C. 811) and regulations 20 thereunder, including section 1306.04 of title 21, 21 Code of Federal Regulations, decline to fill a pre-22 scription for a controlled substance because the 23 pharmacist suspects the prescription is fraudulent, 24 forged, or otherwise indicative of abuse or diversion; 25 and

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(2) any Federal requirements pertaining to de clining to fill a prescription under such circum stances.

4 (b) MATERIALS INCLUDED.—In developing materials
5 under subsection (a), the Secretary of Health and Human
6 Services shall include information educating—

7 (1) pharmacists on how to decline to fill a pre8 scription and actions to take after declining to fill a
9 prescription; and

10 (2) other health care practitioners and the pub11 lic on a pharmacist's responsibility to decline to fill
12 prescriptions in certain circumstances.

(c) STAKEHOLDER INPUT.—In developing the programs and materials required under subsection (a), the
Secretary of Health and Human Services shall seek input
from relevant national, State, and local associations,
boards of pharmacy, medical societies, licensing boards,
health care practitioners, and patients.
