AN ACT

- To provide for a report on broadening participation in certain National Science Foundation research and education programs, to collect data on Federal research grants to science agencies, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "STEM Research and3 Education Effectiveness and Transparency Act".

4 SEC. 2. BROADENING PARTICIPATION IN STEM PROGRAM 5 EFFECTIVENESS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 12 months after 7 the date of enactment of this Act, the Director of the Na-8 tional Science Foundation shall submit a report to Con-9 gress on the effectiveness of all National Science Foundation research and education programs for broadening the 10 11 participation of women and other historically underrepresented individuals in STEM studies and careers, includ-12 13 ing—

- 14 (1) development or identification of perform-15 ance metrics to evaluate such programs;
- 16 (2) information on student outcomes using all
 17 available data, including dropout rates, enrollment in
 18 graduate programs, internships or apprenticeships,
 19 and employment;

20 (3) identification of any data gaps for evalu21 ating the effectiveness and outcomes of National
22 Science Foundation programs to broaden participa23 tion; and

24 (4) recommendations for maintaining, trans-25 lating, and disseminating outcomes data for STEM

programs funded by the National Science Founda tion.

3 (b) DEFINITION OF STEM.—In this section, the
4 term "STEM" has the meaning given the term in section
5 2 of the America COMPETES Reauthorization Act of
6 2010 (42 U.S.C. 6621 note).

7 SEC. 3. COLLECTION AND REPORTING OF DATA ON FED8 ERAL RESEARCH GRANTS.

9 (a) Collection of Data.—

10 (1) IN GENERAL.—Each Federal science agency 11 shall collect standardized record-level annual infor-12 mation on demographics, primary field, award type, 13 review rating, budget request, funding outcome, and 14 awarded budget for all applications for merit-re-15 viewed research and development grants to institu-16 tions of higher education and Federal laboratories 17 supported by that agency.

(2) UNIFORMITY AND STANDARDIZATION.—The
Director shall establish a policy to ensure uniformity
and standardization of the data collection required
under paragraph (1).

22 (3) Record-level data.—

23 (A) REQUIREMENT.—On an annual basis,
24 beginning with the deadline under subpara25 graph (C), each Federal science agency shall

submit to the Director of the National Science Foundation record-level data collected under paragraph (1) in the form required by such Director.

5 (B) PREVIOUS DATA.—As part of the first
6 submission under subparagraph (A), each Fed7 eral science agency, to the extent practicable,
8 shall submit comparable record-level data for
9 the 5 years preceding the deadline under sub10 paragraph (C).

11 (C) DEADLINE.—The deadline under this
12 paragraph is not later than 1 year after the
13 date of enactment of this Act.

(b) REPORTING OF DATA.—The Director of the Na-14 15 tional Science Foundation shall publish statistical summary data collected under this section, disaggregated and 16 17 cross-tabulated demographically and by years since completion of doctoral degree, including in conjunction with 18 the National Science Foundation's report required by sec-19 tion 37 of the Science and Technology Equal Opportuni-20 21 ties Act (42 U.S.C. 1885d; Public Law 96–516).

22 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) DIRECTOR.—The term "Director" means
the Director of the Office of Science and Technology
Policy.

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(2) FEDERAL LABORATORY.—The term "Fed eral laboratory" has the meaning given that term in
 section 4 of the Stevenson-Wydler Technology Inno vation Act of 1980 (15 U.S.C. 3703).

5 (3) FEDERAL SCIENCE AGENCY.—The term
6 "Federal science agency" means any Federal agency
7 with at least \$100,000,000 in research and develop8 ment expenditures in fiscal year 2017.

9 (4) INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.—The
10 term "institution of higher education" has the
11 meaning given such term in section 101(a) of the
12 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001(a)).
