3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Natural Gas Pipeline
- 5 Public Health Protection Act of 2017".

SEC. 2. SUSPENSION OF CERTIFICATE OF PUBLIC CONVEN IENCE AND NECESSITY IN AREAS WITH PRE EXISTING UNSAFE AIR POLLUTANT LEVELS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Where certified independent air 5 quality testing demonstrates an existing violation of a national ambient air quality standard promulgated under 6 7 section 109 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7409), or 8 of a requirement relating to a hazardous air pollutant list-9 ed under section 112 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 10 7412), at a site (including any community surrounding 11 such site) that is identified as the proposed location of a project for which a certificate of public convenience and 12 13 necessity has been issued to a covered holder, until such time as the State environmental authority with jurisdic-14 tion over the project site conducts certified independent 15 16 air quality testing (or other air quality testing using methods that have been approved by the State environmental 17 authority or the Environmental Protection Agency) and 18 19 certifies to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission 20that any such violation has been remediated—

(1) the covered holder shall suspend all activities authorized by the certificate of public convenience and necessity of the covered holder; and

(2) the Commission may not issue any new certificate of public convenience and necessity under
section 7 of the Natural Gas Act (15 U.S.C. 717f)
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to the covered holder with respect to the applicable
 project or project site (including any community sur rounding such site).

4 (b) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term "covered 5 holder" means a holder of a certificate of public conven-6 ience and necessity, issued under section 7 of the Natural 7 Gas Act, during the two-year period ending on the date 8 of enactment of this Act, that has not commenced con-9 struction of the project for which such certificate was 10 issued by such date of enactment.

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
