## AN ACT

To require the Federal Air Marshal Service to utilize riskbased strategies, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Strengthening Aviation3 Security Act of 2018".

4 SEC. 2. USE OF RISK-BASED STRATEGIES BY FEDERAL AIR
5 MARSHAL SERVICE.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a) of section 44917
7 of title 49, United States Code, is amended—

8 (1) in paragraph (7), by striking "and" after9 the semicolon at the end;

10 (2) in paragraph (8), by striking the period at11 the end and inserting a semicolon; and

12 (3) by adding at the end the following new13 paragraphs:

"(9) shall require the Federal Air Marshal
Service to utilize a risk-based strategy when allocating resources between international and domestic
flight coverage, including when initially setting its
annual target numbers of average daily international
and domestic flights to cover;

20 "(10) shall require the Federal Air Marshal
21 Service to utilize a risk-based strategy to support
22 domestic allocation decisions;

23 "(11) shall require the Federal Air Marshal
24 Service to utilize a risk-based strategy to support
25 international allocation decisions; and

"(12) shall ensure that the seating arrangements of Federal air marshals on aircraft are determined in a manner that is risk-based and most capable of responding to current threats to aviation security.".

6 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 270 days after the date 7 of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the 8 Transportation Security Administration shall submit to 9 the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of 10 Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs and the Committee on Com-11 merce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a report 12 13 that describes the compliance of the Federal Air Marshal Service with the requirements specified in paragraphs (9) 14 15 through (12) of subsection (a) of section 44917 of title 49, United States Code, as added by this Act, and the 16 17 documented methodology used by the Federal Air Marshal 18 Service to conduct risk assessments in accordance with 19 such paragraphs.

(c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The Transportation Security
Administration shall begin carrying out the requirements
specified in paragraphs (9) through (12) of subsection (a)
of section 44917, United States Code, added by this Act,

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1 by not later than the date that is 180 days after the date

2 of the enactment of this Act.
