SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- This Act may be cited as the "Justice Served Act
- 3 of 2018".
- 4 SEC. 2. PROSECUTION OF DNA COLD CASES.
- 5 (a) Debbie Smith DNA Backlog Grant Pro-
- 6 GRAM.—Section 2 of the DNA Analysis Backlog Elimi-
- 7 nation Act of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 40701) is amended—
- 8 (1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the
- 9 following:
- 10 "(9) To increase the capacity of State and local
- prosecution offices to address the backlog of violent
- crime cases in which suspects have been identified
- through DNA evidence."; and
- 14 (2) in subsection (c), by adding at the end the
- 15 following:
- 16 "(5) Allocation of grant awards for
- 17 PROSECUTORS.—For each fiscal year, not less than
- 5 percent, but not more than 7 percent, of the grant
- amounts distributed under paragraph (1) shall, if
- sufficient applications to justify such amounts are
- 21 received by the Attorney General, be awarded for
- purposes described in subsection (a)(9), provided
- that none of the funds required to be distributed
- under this paragraph shall decrease or otherwise
- limit the availability of funds required to be awarded

- 1 to States or units of local government under para-
- 2 graph (3).".
- 3 (b) Prosecution of Cold Cases.—Of the amounts
- 4 made available to the Attorney General for a DNA Anal-
- 5 ysis and capacity enhancement program and for other
- 6 local, State, and Federal forensic activities for the purpose
- 7 described in section 2 of the DNA Analysis Backlog Elimi-
- 8 nation Act of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 40701) under the heading
- 9 "STATE AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE"
- 10 under the heading "Office of Justice Programs"
- 11 under the heading "DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE" in
- 12 fiscal years 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022, not less than
- 13 5 percent, but not more than 7 percent, of such amounts
- 14 shall be provided for grants for prosecutors to increase
- 15 the capacity of State and local prosecution offices to ad-
- 16 dress cold cases involving violent crime, where suspects
- 17 have been identified through DNA evidence.
