A BILL

To prohibit the transfer of a firearm to a person whose State license to purchase, own, or possess a firearm has been revoked, or a person who has been ordered by a State court to surrender all firearms.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “State Access to Fire-
5 arms Evading Revocation Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON TRANSFER OF FIREARM TO PER-**
2 **SON WHOSE STATE LICENSE TO PURCHASE,**
3 **OWN, OR POSSESS A FIREARM HAS BEEN RE-**
4 **VOKED OR WHO HAS BEEN ORDERED BY A**
5 **STATE COURT TO SURRENDER ALL FIRE-**
6 **ARMS.**

7 Section 922(d) of title 18, United States Code, is
8 amended in the 1st sentence—

9 (1) by striking “or” at the end of paragraph
10 (8);

11 (2) by striking the period at the end of para-
12 graph (9); and

13 (3) by adding at the end the following:

14 “(10)(A) has had a license or permit, issued by
15 a State in which the person has resided that allows
16 the person to purchase, own, or possess a firearm,
17 revoked by the State, and has not had the license or
18 permit reinstated; or

19 “(B) has been ordered by a court of such a
20 State to surrender all firearms owned or possessed
21 by the person, and has not had the firearms lawfully
22 returned.”.

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
