A BILL

To establish the Pearl Harbor National Memorial in the State of Hawai'i and the Honouliuli National Historic Site in the State of Hawai'i, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “World War II Pacific
5 Sites Establishment Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PEARL HARBOR NATIONAL MEMORIAL, HAWAII.**

7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

8 (1) MAP.—The term “Map” means the map en-
9 titled “Pearl Harbor National Memorial—Proposed
10 Boundary”, numbered 580/140,514, and dated No-
11 vember 2017.

12 (2) NATIONAL MEMORIAL.—The term “Na-
13 tional Memorial” means the Pearl Harbor National
14 Memorial established by subsection (b)(1)(A).

15 (3) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
16 the Secretary of the Interior.

17 (b) PEARL HARBOR NATIONAL MEMORIAL.—

18 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.—

19 (A) IN GENERAL.—There is established the
20 Pearl Harbor National Memorial in the State of
21 Hawai'i as a unit of the National Park System.

22 (B) BOUNDARIES.—The boundaries of the
23 National Memorial shall be the boundaries gen-
24 erally depicted on the Map.

1 (C) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The Map
2 shall be on file and available for public inspec-
3 tion in appropriate offices of the National Park
4 Service.

5 (2) PURPOSES.—The purposes of the National
6 Memorial are to preserve, interpret, and commemo-
7 rate for the benefit of present and future genera-
8 tions the history of World War II in the Pacific from
9 the events leading to the December 7, 1941, attack
10 on O’ahu, to peace and reconciliation.

11 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—The Secretary shall admin-
12 ister the National Memorial in accordance with this sec-
13 tion, section 121 of Public Law 111–88, and the laws gen-
14 erally applicable to units of the National Park System in-
15 cluding—

16 (1) section 100101(a), chapter 1003, and sec-
17 tions 100751(a), 100752, 100753, and 102101 of
18 title 54, United States Code; and

19 (2) chapter 3201 of title 54, United States
20 Code.

21 (d) REMOVAL OF PEARL HARBOR NATIONAL MEMO-
22 RIAL FROM WORLD WAR II VALOR IN THE PACIFIC NA-
23 TIONAL MONUMENT.—

24 (1) BOUNDARIES.—The boundaries of World
25 War II Valor in the Pacific National Monument are

1 revised to exclude from the monument the land and
2 interests in land identified as the “Pearl Harbor Na-
3 tional Memorial” as depicted on the Map.

4 (2) INCORPORATION INTO NATIONAL MEMO-
5 RIAL.—

6 (A) IN GENERAL.—The land and interests
7 in land excluded from the monument under
8 paragraph (1) are incorporated in and made
9 part of the National Memorial in accordance
10 with this section.

11 (B) USE OF FUNDS.—Any funds for the
12 purposes of the land and interests in land ex-
13 cluded from the monument under paragraph (1)
14 shall be made available for the purposes of the
15 National Memorial.

16 (C) REFERENCES.—Any references in law
17 (other than in this Act), regulation, document,
18 record, map or other paper of the United States
19 to resources in the State of Hawai’i included in
20 the World War II Valor in the Pacific National
21 Monument shall be considered a reference to
22 Pearl Harbor National Memorial.

23 **SEC. 3. HONOLULI NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE, HAWAII.**

24 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1 (1) HISTORIC SITE.—The term “Historic Site”
2 means the Honouliuli National Historic Site estab-
3 lished by subsection (b)(1)(A).

4 (2) MAP.—The term “Map” means the map en-
5 titled “Honouliuli National Historic Site—Proposed
6 Boundary”, numbered 680/139428, and dated June
7 2017.

8 (3) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
9 the Secretary of the Interior.

10 (b) HONOULIULI NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE.—

11 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.—

12 (A) IN GENERAL.—There is established the
13 Honouliuli National Historic Site in the State
14 of Hawai’i as a unit of the National Park Sys-
15 tem.

16 (B) BOUNDARIES.—The boundaries of the
17 Historic Site shall be the boundaries generally
18 depicted on the Map.

19 (C) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The Map
20 shall be on file and available for public inspec-
21 tion in appropriate offices of the National Park
22 Service.

23 (2) PURPOSES.—The purposes of the Historic
24 Site are to preserve and interpret for the benefit of
25 present and future generations the history associated

1 with the internment and detention of civilians of
2 Japanese and other ancestries during World War II
3 in Hawai'i, the impacts of war and martial law on
4 society in the Hawaiian Islands, and the co-location
5 and diverse experiences of Prisoners of War at the
6 Honouliuli Internment Camp site.

7 (c) ADMINISTRATION.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall admin-
9 ister the Historic Site in accordance with this sec-
10 tion and the laws generally applicable to units of the
11 National Park System, including—

12 (A) section 100101(a), chapter 1003, and
13 sections 100751(a), 100752, 100753, and
14 102101 of title 54, United States Code; and

15 (B) chapter 3201 of title 54, United States
16 Code.

17 (2) PARTNERSHIPS.—

18 (A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may
19 enter into agreements with, or acquire ease-
20 ments from, the owners of property adjacent to
21 the Historic Site to provide public access to the
22 Historic Site.

23 (B) INTERPRETATION.—The Secretary
24 may enter into cooperative agreements with
25 governmental and nongovernmental organiza-

1 tions to provide for interpretation at the His-
2 toric Site.

3 (3) SHARED RESOURCES.—To the maximum
4 extent practicable, the Secretary may use the re-
5 sources of the Pearl Harbor National Memorial to
6 administer the Historic Site.

7 (d) ABOLISHMENT OF HONOULIULI NATIONAL
8 MONUMENT.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—In light of the establishment
10 of the Honouliuli National Historic Site, the
11 Honouliuli National Monument is hereby abolished
12 and the lands and interests therein are incorporated
13 within and made part of Honouliuli National His-
14 toric Site. Any funds available for purposes of
15 Honouliuli National Monument shall be available for
16 purposes of the Historic Site.

17 (2) REFERENCES.—Any references in law
18 (other than in this Act), regulation, document,
19 record, map or other paper of the United States to
20 Honouliuli National Monument shall be considered a
21 reference to Honouliuli National Historic Site.

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
