AN ACT

To rename the Oyster Bay National Wildlife Refuge as the Congressman Lester Wolff National Wildlife Refuge.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

2 The Congress finds the following:

3 (1) The Oyster Bay National Wildlife Refuge
4 was created in 1968. It is located on the north shore
5 of Long Island in eastern Nassau County, is the
6 largest refuge in the Long Island National Wildlife
7 Refuge Complex, and receives the most public use of
8 all the refuges in the Complex.

9 (2) The State of New York designated Oyster 10 Bay a significant coastal fish and wildlife habitat. It 11 is especially important for wintering waterfowl such 12 as black duck, greater scaup, bufflehead, canvasback 13 and long-tailed ducks. Management activities include 14 wetland restoration and protection of the natural 15 shoreline and vegetation.

16 (3) The refuge is unique in consisting solely of
17 bay bottom and adjacent shoreline up to the mean
18 high-tide mark. Ninety percent of New York's com19 mercial oyster harvest comes from the refuge. Visi20 tors enjoy fishing, wildlife observation, photography
21 and environmental education. The refuge is truly a
22 national treasure.

(4) Many visitors are unaware that were it not
for the tireless work and advocacy of then-freshman
Congressman Lester Wolff, this area would today be
an 8.5-mile causeway and bridge across Long Island

Sound between Oyster Bay and Rye, New York, connecting Nassau and Westchester Counties.

3 (5) The bridge was first proposed by Robert
4 Moses, the well-known New York City Planner, to
5 divert traffic from New York City. Former Governor
6 Nelson Rockefeller signed into law legislation cre7 ating the bridge authorized by the New York State
8 Legislature in 1967.

9 (6) Congressman Wolff, elected in 1964, quick-10 ly decided the bridge would be an intrusion in a pris-11 tine area, and that Long Island Sound was a very 12 precious resource that was despoiled. The conserva-13 tion threats in the mid-1960s were suburban devel-14 opment, wetland filling, and industrial pollution. The 15 fight to preserve this land became an enormous po-16 litical fight and is considered to be a turning point 17 in New York State's environmental legacy.

18 (7) With State and local political and commu-19 nity leaders, and especially the North Shore leaders 20 and the Committee to Save the Long Island Sound, 21 Congressman Wolff arranged a meeting with De-22 partment of the Interior representatives and local 23 leaders where the idea of creating a wildlife refuge 24 from municipal and privately owned wetlands was 25 created.

1	(8) The Town of Oyster Bay, in which one end
2	of the bridge was to be located, deeded 5,000 acres
3	of wetlands to the United States to be maintained
4	as a Federal wildlife preserve. It was stipulated that
5	if the Department of the Interior agreed to an intru-
6	sion of the property, it would revert to the town.
7	Creating a Federal wildlife preserve provided the
8	land with Federal protection.
9	(9) Because of the vision, dedication, and perse-
10	verance of Congressman Lester Wolff, all of us and
11	future generations can enjoy the beauty and mag-
12	nificence of this refuge.
