1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Mark Takai Atomic
5 Veterans Healthcare Parity Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. TREATMENT OF VETERANS WHO PARTICIPATED IN**
2 **CLEANUP OF ENEWETAK ATOLL AS RADI-**
3 **ATION EXPOSED VETERANS FOR PURPOSES**
4 **OF PRESUMPTION OF SERVICE-CONNECTION**
5 **OF CERTAIN DISABILITIES BY DEPARTMENT**
6 **OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.**

7 Section 1112(c)(3)(B) of title 38, United States
8 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
9 clause:

10 “(v) Cleanup of Enewetak Atoll dur-
11 ing the period beginning on January 1,
12 1977, and ending on December 31,
13 1980.”.

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
