A BILL

To amend the REAL ID Act of 2005 to remove the provision requiring each State to provide all other States with electronic access to information contained in the motor vehicle database of the State, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “REAL ID Privacy Pro-
5 tection Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. IMPROVEMENTS RELATING TO REAL ID ACT OF**
2 **2005.**

3 (a) REMOVAL OF REQUIREMENT RELATING TO RE-
4 TENTION OF SOURCE DOCUMENTS AND ELECTRONIC AC-
5 CESS TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE DATABASE OF EACH
6 STATE.—Section 202(d) of the REAL ID Act of 2005
7 (Public Law 109–13; 49 U.S.C. 30301 note) is amend-
8 ed—

9 (1) by striking paragraphs (2) and (12);

10 (2) by redesignating paragraphs (3) through
11 (11) as paragraphs (2) through (10), respectively;
12 and

13 (3) by redesignating paragraph (13) as para-
14 graph (11).

15 (b) EXTENSION OF DEADLINE FOR COMPLIANCE.—
16 If any State is not in compliance with the requirements
17 under section 202 of the REAL ID Act of 2005, has re-
18 ceived a limited extension of the deadline for compliance,
19 or is under review for compliance as of the date of the
20 enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security
21 shall grant such State an extension of the deadline for
22 compliance through October 10, 2017.

23 (c) REPORT RELATING TO MATERIAL COMPLIANCE
24 CHECKLIST FOR REAL ID ACT OF 2005.—Not later than
25 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the

1 Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit a report to
2 Congress that—

3 (1) describes the requirements of the material
4 compliance checklist for the REAL ID Act of 2005,
5 which is established and maintained by the Sec-
6 retary;

7 (2) describes whether and how each State com-
8 plies with each requirement of the material compli-
9 ance checklist; and

10 (3) based on the information provided under
11 paragraph (2), includes a justification for the status
12 of each State with respect to compliance with the re-
13 quirements of the REAL ID Act of 2005.

14 (d) STATE DEFINED.—In this section, the term
15 “State” has the meaning given that term in section 201
16 of the REAL ID Act of 2005.

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
