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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 184) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to repeal the excise tax on medical devices, and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6311) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act to modify the definition of qualified health plan for purposes of the health insurance premium tax credit and to allow individuals purchasing health insur-

ance in the individual market to purchase a lower premium copper plan.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.  
3 184) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to re-  
4 peal the excise tax on medical devices. All points of order  
5 against consideration of the bill are waived. The amend-  
6 ment printed in the report of the Committee on Rules ac-  
7 companying this resolution shall be considered as adopted.  
8 The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All  
9 points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended,  
10 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as  
11 ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further  
12 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening  
13 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and  
14 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
15 the Committee on Ways and Means; and (2) one motion  
16 to recommit with or without instructions.

17       SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
18 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 6311)  
19 to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and the Pa-  
20 tient Protection and Affordable Care Act to modify the  
21 definition of qualified health plan for purposes of the  
22 health insurance premium tax credit and to allow individ-  
23 uals purchasing health insurance in the individual market  
24 to purchase a lower premium copper plan. All points of

1 order against consideration of the bill are waived. In lieu  
2 of the amendment in the nature of a substitute rec-  
3 ommended by the Committee on Ways and Means, an  
4 amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the  
5 text of Rules Committee Print 115-83 shall be considered  
6 as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as  
7 read. All points of order against provisions in the bill, as  
8 amended, are waived. The previous question shall be con-  
9 sidered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any  
10 further amendment thereto, to final passage without inter-  
11 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-  
12 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority  
13 member of the Committee on Ways and Means; and (2)  
14 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

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
