A BILL

To protect the right of law-abiding citizens to transport
knives interstate, notwithstanding a patchwork of local
and State prohibitions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Interstate Transport
5 Act of 2017”.

6 **SEC. 2. INTERSTATE TRANSPORTATION OF KNIVES.**

7 (a) TRANSPORT OF KNIVES.—Notwithstanding any
8 other provision of any law or any rule or regulation of
9 a State or any political subdivision thereof, any person

1 who is not otherwise prohibited by any Federal law, rule,
2 or regulation from transporting, shipping, or receiving a
3 knife shall be entitled to transport a knife for any lawful
4 purpose from any place where the person may lawfully
5 possess and carry such knife to any other place where the
6 person may lawfully possess and carry such knife if—

7 (1) in the case of a mode of transportation sub-
8 ject to rules and regulations of the Transportation
9 Security Administration or the Coast Guard, the in-
10 dividual complies with all applicable rules and regu-
11 lations of the Transportation Security Administra-
12 tion or the Coast Guard, respectively; and

13 (2) in the case of a mode of transportation not
14 subject to rules and regulations of the Transpor-
15 tation Security Administration or the Coast Guard,
16 during such transportation, any such knife that is
17 being transported and that is not legal for the per-
18 son to possess in a jurisdiction through which the
19 person is traveling—

20 (A) is not readily accessible or directly ac-
21 cessible from the passenger compartment of the
22 mode of transportation; or

23 (B) in the case of a mode of transportation
24 without a compartment separate from the pas-
25 senger compartment, is contained in a locked

1 container other than the glove compartment or
2 console.

3 (b) EMERGENCY KNIVES.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—An individual—

5 (A) may carry in the passenger compart-
6 ment of a mode of transportation a knife or
7 tool—

8 (i) the blades of which consist only of
9 a blunt tipped safety blade, a guarded
10 blade, or both; and

11 (ii) that is specifically designed for en-
12 abling escape in an emergency by cutting
13 safety belts; and

14 (B) shall not be required to secure a knife
15 or tool described in subparagraph (A) in any
16 locked container.

17 (2) LIMITATION.—This subsection shall not
18 apply to the transport of a knife or tool by a mode
19 of transportation that is subject to rules and regula-
20 tions of the Transportation Security Administration
21 or the Coast Guard.

22 (c) NO ARREST OR DETENTION.—An individual who
23 is transporting a knife in compliance with this section may
24 not be arrested or otherwise detained for violation of any
25 law, rule, or regulation of a State or political subdivision

1 of a State related to the possession, transport, or carrying
2 of a knife, unless there is probable cause to believe that
3 the individual is not in compliance with subsection (a).

4 (d) CLAIM OR DEFENSE.—An individual may assert
5 this section as a claim or defense in any civil or criminal
6 action or proceeding. When an individual asserts this sec-
7 tion as a claim or defense in a criminal proceeding, the
8 State or political subdivision shall have the burden of prov-
9 ing, beyond a reasonable doubt, that the individual was
10 not in compliance with subsection (a).

11 (e) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-
12 tion shall be construed to limit any right to possess, carry,
13 or transport a knife under applicable State law.

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
