Mrs. MCCASKILL (for herself and Mr. LEE) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To provide for joint reports by relevant Federal agencies to Congress regarding incidents of terrorism, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Reporting Efficiently
5 to Proper Officials in Response to Terrorism Act of 2017”
6 or the “REPORT Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. DUTY TO REPORT.**

8 (a) DUTY IMPOSED.—Whenever an act of terrorism
9 occurs in the United States, it shall be the duty of the

1 Secretary of Homeland Security, the Attorney General,
2 the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and,
3 as appropriate, the head of the National Counterterrorism
4 Center, to submit, within 1 year of the completion of the
5 investigation concerning such act by the primary Govern-
6 ment agency conducting such investigation, an unclassi-
7 fied report (which may be accompanied by a classified
8 annex) to Congress concerning such act.

9 (b) CONTENT OF REPORTS.—A report under this sec-
10 tion shall—

11 (1) include a statement of the facts of the act
12 of terrorism referred to in subsection (a), as known
13 at the time of the report;

14 (2) identify any gaps in national security that
15 could be addressed to prevent future acts of ter-
16 rorism; and

17 (3) any recommendations for additional meas-
18 ures that could be taken to improve homeland secu-
19 rity, including potential changes in law enforcement
20 practices or changes in law, with particular attention
21 to changes that could help prevent future acts of ter-
22 rorism.

23 (c) EXCEPTION.—The duty established under sub-
24 section (a) shall not apply in instances in which the Sec-
25 retary of Homeland Security, the Attorney General, the

1 Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, or the
2 head of the National Counterterrorism Center determines
3 that the information required to be reported could jeop-
4 ardize an ongoing investigation or prosecution. In such in-
5 stances, the Secretary shall notify Congress of such prior
6 to the first anniversary of the completion of the investiga-
7 tion described in such subsection.

8 (d) DEFINITION.—In this section, the term “act of
9 terrorism” has the meaning given such term in section
10 3077 of title 18, United States Code.

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
