A BILL

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Alaska Remote Gener-
- 5 ator Reliability and Protection Act".

1 SEC. 2. REVISION OF REGULATIONS REQUIRED.

- 2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
- 3 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the
- 4 Environmental Protection Agency shall revise section
- 5 60.4216(e) of title 40, Code of Federal Regulations (as
- 6 in effect on the date of enactment of this Act), by striking
- 7 ", except that for 2014 model year" and all that follows
- 8 through "compared to engine-out emissions".
- 9 (b) ELECTRICITY AND ENERGY RELIABILITY.—A re-
- 10 vision of section 60.4216 of title 40, Code of Federal Reg-
- 11 ulations, may require the installation of emission control
- 12 devices only if, after consultation with the Secretary of
- 13 Energy, the Administrator of the Environmental Protec-
- 14 tion Agency determines that such a requirement will not
- 15 negatively affect electricity or energy reliability in any re-
- 16 mote area of the State of Alaska.

- 21 (a) In General.—The Administrator of the Environ-

- 24 date of enactment of this Act), by striking "that was not
- 25 certified" and all that follows through "compared to engine-

out emissions" and inserting "must have that engine certified as meeting at least Tier 3 PM standards". 3 (b) Emissions and Energy Reliability Study.— Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency, in consultation with the Secretary of Energy, shall submit to the Committee on Environment and Public Works 8 of the Senate and the Committee on Energy and Commerce of the House of Representatives a report assessing options for the Federal Government to assist remote areas in the State of Alaska in meeting the energy needs of those areas in an affordable and reliable manner using— 13 (1) existing emissions control technology; or 14 (2) other technology that achieves emissions re-15 ductions similar to the technology described in para-

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graph (1).
