## A BILL

To prohibit the United States Government from barring refugees from entering the United States based on their country of origin.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3        **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4        This Act may be cited as the “No Ban on Refugees  
5        Act”.

6        **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7        Congress finds the following:

1           (1) An individual’s country of origin is unlikely  
2 to be an indicator of his or her threat to the security  
3 of the United States.

4           (2) Since 1980, there has not been a single le-  
5 thal terrorist attack in the United States that was  
6 committed by a refugee.

7           (3) The United States accepts the most vulner-  
8 able refugees for resettlement, the vast majority of  
9 whom are women and children.

10           (4) The need for stable countries willing to wel-  
11 come refugees has never been greater. The United  
12 Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR)  
13 has reported that the level of forcibly displaced peo-  
14 ple worldwide is “the highest since the aftermath of  
15 World War II”.

16           (5) Refugees are, by definition, fleeing insecure  
17 or war-torn countries, such as Syria, Afghanistan,  
18 South Sudan, Somalia, and Yemen.

19           (6) The refugee vetting process involves at least  
20 8 United States Government agencies and does not  
21 rely primarily on information provided by the refu-  
22 gees’ countries of origin.

23 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITION.**

24           Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no agen-  
25 cy or instrumentality of the United States Government

1 may prevent a refugee (as defined in section 101(a)(42)  
2 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.  
3 1101(a)(42))) from entering the United States based on  
4 the refugee's country of origin.
