## A BILL

To authorize the United States Postal Service to inspect the contents of certain suspicious packages for illicit materials without a warrant.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Search Now, Inspect  
5       for Fentanyl Act of 2018” or the “SNIFF Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORITY OF UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE**  
 2 **TO INSPECT CERTAIN SUSPICIOUS PACK-**  
 3 **AGES.**

4 Section 404 of title 39, United States Code, is  
 5 amended by adding at the end the following:

6 “(f) **AUTHORITY TO INSPECT CERTAIN SUSPICIOUS**  
 7 **PACKAGES.**—

8 “(1) **DEFINITIONS.**—In this subsection—

9 “(A) the term ‘covered package’ means a  
 10 package that—

11 “(i) originated outside the United  
 12 States; and

13 “(ii) is addressed to a location within  
 14 the United States;

15 “(B) the term ‘qualified employee’ means  
 16 an employee of the Postal Service who has been  
 17 properly trained to inspect the contents of cov-  
 18 ered packages; and

19 “(C) the term ‘United States’ includes any  
 20 territory or possession of the United States.

21 “(2) **AUTHORITY.**—

22 “(A) **IN GENERAL.**—Except as provided in  
 23 subparagraph (B), and notwithstanding sub-  
 24 section (c), if a qualified employee acting in his  
 25 or her official capacity at an international serv-  
 26 ice center that processes inbound international

1 mail has probable cause to believe that a cov-  
2 ered package contains illicit materials, including  
3 matter that is nonmailable under section 3001,  
4 the employee shall, without obtaining a search  
5 warrant, inspect the contents of the covered  
6 package.

7 “(B) SAFETY EXCEPTION.—The require-  
8 ment under subparagraph (A) shall not apply  
9 with respect to a covered package if a qualified  
10 employee believes that inspecting the contents  
11 of the covered package would pose a risk of per-  
12 sonal injury to the employee or other individ-  
13 uals.

14 “(3) RULES OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in  
15 paragraph (2) shall be construed to authorize—

16 “(A) any employee of the Postal Service to  
17 inspect a covered package, after the package  
18 has entered the domestic distribution network,  
19 without obtaining a search warrant; or

20 “(B) any person to read correspondence  
21 contained in a covered package without obtain-  
22 ing a search warrant.”.
