A BILL

To amend chapter 5 of title 40, United States Code, to improve the management of Federal personal property.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Personal Prop-
- 5 erty Management Act of 2018".
- 6 SEC. 2. FEDERAL PERSONAL PROPERTY MANAGEMENT.
- 7 (a) Inventory Assessing and Identifying Ex-
- 8 CESS PERSONAL PROPERTY.—Section 524(a) of title 40,
- 9 United States Code, is amended—

1	(1) in paragraph (11), by striking "and" at the
2	end;
3	(2) in paragraph (12), by striking the period at
4	the end and inserting "; and; and
5	(3) by adding at the end the following:
6	"(13) in accordance with guidance from the Ad-
7	ministrator of General Services—
8	"(A) on an annual basis, conduct an inven-
9	tory and assessment of capitalized personal
10	property to identify excess capitalized personal
11	property under its control, including evalu-
12	ating—
13	"(i) the age and condition of the per-
14	sonal property;
15	"(ii) the extent to which the executive
16	agency utilizes the personal property;
17	"(iii) the extent to which the mission
18	of the executive agency is dependent on the
19	personal property; and
20	"(iv) any other aspect of the personal
21	property that the Administrator deter-
22	mines is useful or necessary for the execu-
23	tive agency to evaluate; and
24	"(B) on a regular basis, conduct an inven-
25	tory and assessment of accountable personal

1	property under its control, including evalu-
2	ating—
3	"(i) the age and condition of the per-
4	sonal property;
5	"(ii) the extent to which the executive
6	agency utilizes the personal property;
7	"(iii) the extent to which the mission
8	of the executive agency is dependent on the
9	personal property; and
10	"(iv) any other aspect of the personal
11	property that the Administrator deter-
12	mines is useful or necessary for the execu-
13	tive agency to evaluate.".
14	(b) Thresholds for Capitalization and Ac-
15	COUNTABILITY.—Section 506(a)(1) of title 40, United
16	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
17	lowing:
18	"(E) Capitalization thresholds.—Es-
19	tablish thresholds for acquisitions of personal
20	property for which executive agencies shall cap-
21	italize the personal property.
22	"(F) Accountability thresholds.—
23	Notwithstanding section 121(b), for the man-
24	agement and accountability of personal prop-
25	erty, establish thresholds for acquisitions of

personal property for which executive agencies shall establish and maintain property records in a centralized system.".
