To authorize cyber incident response teams at the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

8	tional funds are authorized to be appropriated to carry out
9	the requirements of this Act and the amendments made by
10	this Act. Such requirements shall be carried out using
11	amounts otherwise authorized to be appropriated.
