referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

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## A BILL

To direct the Office of National Drug Control Policy to  
track and review federally funded drug demand reduction  
activities.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FEDERAL DRUG DEMAND REDUCTION ACTIVI-**  
4 **TIES.**

5 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

6 (1) the term “demand reduction activity”  
7 means any activity, other than an enforcement activ-  
8 ity, that is intended to reduce the use of drugs; and

9 (2) the term “Director” means the Director of  
10 National Drug Control Policy.

1 (b) TRACKING SYSTEM.—The Director—

2 (1) shall establish a system to track federally  
3 funded demand reduction activities; and

4 (2) in establishing the system under paragraph  
5 (1), shall consult with, and leverage any tracking of  
6 federally funded demand reduction activities by—

7 (A) the Secretary of Homeland Security;

8 (B) the Attorney General; and

9 (C) the head of any other Federal agency  
10 that operates a program or awards grants relat-  
11 ing to demand reduction activities.

12 (c) PUBLIC LIST.—The Director shall publish online  
13 a list of all Federal programs and grants relating to de-  
14 mand reduction activities.

15 (d) ANNUAL STRATEGY.—In formulating the annual  
16 National Drug Control Strategy, the Director shall review  
17 all federally funded demand reduction activities, including  
18 an evaluation of—

19 (1) the effectiveness of those activities;

20 (2) the contribution of those activities to de-  
21 mand reduction activities funded by States or units  
22 of local government; and

1           (3) whether any duplication or inefficiency in  
2           federally funded demand reduction activities needs  
3           to be addressed.

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
