## A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Transportation to issue rules requiring the inclusion of new safety equipment in school buses, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "School Bus Safety Act

5 of 2018".

#### 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

- 7 In this Act:
- 8 (1) 3-POINT SAFETY BELT.—The term "3-point
  9 safety belt" has the meaning given the term "Type
  10 2 seat belt assembly" in section 571.209 of title 49,

1	Code of Federal Regulations (as in effect on the
2	date of enactment of this Act).
3	(2) AUTOMATIC EMERGENCY BRAKING SYS-
4	TEM.—The term "automatic emergency braking sys-
5	tem" means a crash avoidance system installed and
6	operational in a vehicle that consists of—
7	(A) a forward collision warning function—
8	(i) to detect vehicles or objects ahead
9	of the vehicle; and
10	(ii) to alert the operator of the vehicle
11	of an impending collision; and
12	(B) a crash-imminent braking function to
13	provide automatic braking when forward-look-
14	ing sensors of the vehicle indicate that—
15	(i) a crash is imminent; and
16	(ii) the operator of vehicle is not re-
17	acting in a timely or appropriate manner.
18	(3) Event data recorder.—The term "event
19	data recorder" has the meaning given the term in
20	section 563.5(b) of title 49, Code of Federal Regula-
21	tions (as in effect on the date of enactment of this
22	Act).
23	(4) School bus.—The term "school bus" has
24	the meaning given the term "schoolbus" in section
25	30125(a) of title 49, United States Code.

(5) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
 the Secretary of Transportation.

#### 3 SEC. 3. SCHOOL BUS SAFETY.

4 (a) SEAT BELT REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 1 5 year after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall issue rules prescribing or amending motor vehicle 6 7 safety standards under chapter 301 of title 49, United 8 States Code, to require school buses with a gross vehicle 9 weight rating of greater than 10,000 pounds to be 10 equipped with a 3-point safety belt at each designated seating position. 11

12 (b) OTHER SAFETY EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS.—
13 Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this
14 Act, the Secretary shall issue rules—

(1) prescribing or amending motor vehicle safety standards under chapter 301 of title 49, United
States Code, to require school buses to be equipped
with—

19 (A) an automatic emergency braking sys-20 tem;

(B) an event data recorder; and
(C) an electronic stability control system,
as defined in section 571.136 of title 49, Code
of Federal Regulations (as in effect on the date
of enactment of this Act); and

1 (2) amending part 383 of title 49, Code of Fed-2 eral Regulations, to require not less than 30 hours 3 of behind-the-wheel instruction for operators of school buses, which shall be accrued on public roads. 4 5 (c) OBSTRUCTIVE SLEEP APNEA.—Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act, the Adminis-6 7 trator of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration 8 and the Administrator of the Federal Railroad Adminis-9 tration shall complete the rulemaking process and publish 10 a final rule with respect to the advance notice of proposed rulemaking entitled "Evaluation of Safety Sensitive Per-11 12 sonnel for Moderate-to-Severe Obstructive Sleep Apnea" 13 (81 Fed. Reg. 12642 (March 10, 2016)).

(d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The standards prescribed or
amendments made pursuant to subsections (a) and (b)
shall apply with respect to school buses manufactured in,
or imported into, the United States on or after the date
that is 1 year after the date on which the Secretary issues
the rules required under the applicable subsection.

#### 20 SEC. 4. STUDIES.

21 (a) MOTION-ACTIVATED DETECTION SYSTEMS.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after
the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator
of the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (referred to in this section as the "Adminis-

trator") shall complete a study with respect to the	
benefits of requiring school buses manufactured in,	
or imported into, the United States to be equipped	
with a motion-activated detection system that is ca-	
pable of—	
(A) detecting pedestrians located near the	
exterior of the school bus; and	
(B) alerting the operator of the school bus	
of the pedestrians described in subparagraph	
(A).	
(2) REGULATIONS.—Not later than 1 year after	
the date on which the Administrator completes the	
study under paragraph (1), the Administrator shall	
issue rules requiring school buses manufactured in,	
or imported into, the United States to effectuate	
that requirement.	
(b) SAFETY BELT ALERT.—Not later than 2 years	
after the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator	
shall complete a study on the benefits of requiring school	
buses manufactured in, or imported into, the United	
States to be equipped with a system to alert the operator	
of the school bus if a passenger in the school bus is not	
3 wearing a 3-point safety belt equipped on the school bus.	
(c) Retrofitting.—Not later than 2 years after the	
date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall	

complete a study with respect to the benefits of requiring
 all school buses operating in the United States to be
 equipped with a 3-point safety belt at each designated
 seating position.

#### 5 SEC. 5. SAFETY BELT GRANT PROGRAM.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the 7 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Transpor-8 tation shall establish a grant program to provide grants 9 to States to make subgrants to local educational agen-10 cies—

(1) to assist the local educational agencies in
purchasing school buses equipped with 3-point safety
belts at each designated seating position; and

(2) to assist the local educational agencies in
modifying school buses already owned by the local
educational agency to be equipped with 3-point safety belts at each designated seating position.

(b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
are authorized to be appropriated such sums as are necessary to carry out this section.

0
