REPORT ON RESOLUTION PRO-VIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 6756, AMERICAN INNOVATION ACT OF 2018; PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION of6757, H.R. FAMILY SAVINGS ACT OF 2018: PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 6760, PROTECTING FAM-ILY AND SMALL BUSINESS TAX CUTS ACT OF 2018; AND PRO-VIDING FOR PROCEEDINGS DUR-ING THE PERIOD FROM OCTOBER 1, 2018, THROUGH NOVEMBER 12,
