Bills

- 1.) H.R. 1066, To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to submit to the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and the House of Representatives a report regarding the organizational structure of the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes. (Rep. Kilmer)
- 2.) H.R. 3122, To protect individuals who are eligible for increased pension under laws administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs on the basis of need of regular aid and attendance from dishonest, predatory, or otherwise unlawful practices, and for other purposes. (Rep. Cartwright)
 - Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 3122 offered by Ms. Esty.
- 3.) H.R. 3561, To amend title 38, United States Code, to permit appraisers approved by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to make appraisals for purposes of chapter 37 of such title based on inspections performed by third parties. (Rep. Arrington)
 - Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 3561 offered by Mr. Arrington.
- 4.) H.R. 3562, To amend title 38, United States Code, to authorize the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to furnish assistance for adaptations of residences of veterans in rehabilitation programs under chapter 31 of such title, and for other purposes. (Rep. Arrington)
- 5.) H.R. 3656, To amend title 38, United States Code, to provide for a consistent eligibility date for provision of Department of Veterans Affairs memorial headstones and markers for eligible spouses and dependent children of veterans whose remains are unavailable. (Rep. Banks)
 - Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 3656 offered by Mr. Banks.
- 6.) H.R. 3657, To amend title 38, United States Code, to authorize the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to provide headstones and markers for the graves of spouses and children of veterans who are buried in tribal cemeteries. (Rep. Poliquin)
 - Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 3657 offered by Mr. Poliquin.
