JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States prohibiting the delegation of the legislative powers granted to Congress.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1	"ARTICLE —
2	"Section 1. Congress may not delegate any of the
3	legislative powers granted to Congress under article I or
4	any article of amendment to any other authority of the
5	United States, any State, or any private authority.
6	"Section 2. Congress may enact such legislation as
7	it considers appropriate, and the President may rescind
8	or terminate any rule, regulation, or order as the Presi-
9	dent considers appropriate, to address the treatment of
10	any legislative power delegated by Congress prior to the
11	ratification of this article.".
