3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Firearm Safety Act
5 of 2019”.

1 **SEC. 2. REMOVAL OF EXCLUSION OF FIREARMS FROM THE**
2 **DEFINITION OF CONSUMER PRODUCT.**

3 Section 3(a)(5) of the Consumer Product Safety Act
4 (15 U.S.C. 2052(a)(5)) is amended by striking subpara-
5 graph (E) and redesignating subparagraphs (F) through
6 (I) as subparagraphs (E) through (H), respectively.

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
