## **AN ACT**

To authorize cyber incident response teams at the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### 2 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. This Act may be cited as the "DHS Cyber Incident 2 3 Response Teams Act of 2019". 4 SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY CYBER IN-5 CIDENT RESPONSE TEAMS. 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 2209 of the Homeland 7 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 148) is amended— 8 (1) in subsection (d)(1)(B)(iv), by inserting ", including cybersecurity specialists" after "entities"; 9 10 (2) by redesignating subsections (f) through 11 (m) as subsections (g) through (n), respectively; 12 (3) by inserting after subsection (e) the fol-13 lowing new subsection (f): "(f) Cyber Incident Response Teams.— 14 "(1) IN GENERAL.—The Center shall maintain 15 16 cyber hunt and incident response teams for the pur-17 pose of providing, as appropriate and upon request, 18 assistance, including the following: 19 "(A) Assistance to asset owners and opera-20 tors in restoring services following a cyber inci-21 dent.

24 "(C) Mitigation strategies to prevent,
 25 deter, and protect against cybersecurity risks.

"(B) The identification of cybersecurity

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- 1 "(D) Recommendations to asset owners 2 and operators for improving overall network 3 and control systems security to lower cybersecu-4 rity risks, and other recommendations, as ap-5 propriate.
  - "(E) Such other capabilities as the Under Secretary appointed under section 103(a)(1)(H) determines appropriate.
  - "(2) Cybersecurity specialists.—The Secretary may include cybersecurity specialists from the private sector on cyber hunt and incident response teams.
  - "(3) Associated metrics.—The Center shall continually assess and evaluate the cyber incident response teams and their operations using robust metrics.
  - "(4) Submittal of information to con-GRESS.—Upon the conclusion of each of the first 4 fiscal years ending after the date of the enactment of this subsection, the Center shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of Representatives and the Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee of the Senate, information on the metrics used for evaluation and assessment of the cyber incident response teams and

2	resources and staffing of such cyber incident re-
3	sponse teams. Such information shall include each of
4	the following for the period covered by the report:
5	"(A) The total number of incident re-
6	sponse requests received.
7	"(B) The number of incident response
8	tickets opened.
9	"(C) All interagency staffing of incident
10	response teams.
11	"(D) The interagency collaborations estab-
12	lished to support incident response teams."; and
13	(4) in subsection (g), as redesignated by para-
14	graph (2)—
15	(A) in paragraph (1), by inserting ", or
16	any team or activity of the Center," after "Cen-
17	ter"; and
18	(B) in paragraph (2), by inserting ", or
19	any team or activity of the Center," after "Cen-
20	ter".
21	(b) No Additional Funds Authorized.—No ad-
22	ditional funds are authorized to be appropriated to carry
23	out the requirements of this Act and the amendments

- 1 made by this Act. Such requirements shall be carried out
- 2 using amounts otherwise authorized to be appropriated.
